They take up all sorts of arguments and claims, but they will not handle serpents. Yet the Scriptures tell us, "They shall handle serpents." We don't talk and uncover error enough. Error says, Don't talk about me — talk about God.

A man has no right to do wrong. His right is to do and think right. Independence consists in his liberty and right to do right. The misconstruction of the word independence is the offspring of malicious animal magnetism. Beware of defending your right to do wrong, and be strong to defend yourself against the right to do evil.

Man's right is his power and privilege to act independently of evil suggestions or motives, and he has neither right nor liberty to do wrong. Neither divine law nor human law recognizes the right of man to sin, to steal, to commit adultery, to murder; and to do these things no more means independence than no means yes, or good means evil. So long as he exercises this mistaken sense of right, he will wrong himself and others, heap up wrath against the day of wrath, and bring upon himself punishment according to his deeds.

Recorded Healings by Mary Baker Eddy

The following is from a collection of healings achieved by Mrs. Eddy, included in the booklet, "The Overwhelming Evidence Concerning Spiritual Healings Through Mary Baker Eddy," compiled by Ralph Spencer. This booklet is available from Plainfield Church.

While Mrs. Eddy was living on Columbus Avenue, Boston, she enjoyed seeing a little baby who lived across the street. After a time she missed the smiles of the little one and wondered what had happened. One morning she noticed the doctor's carriage leaving the home. Mrs. Eddy went over to the house, spoke with the mother, and asked to see the child. The mother said her child had died while the doctor was there. Mrs. Eddy went and sat beside the child and became so conscious of the eternal Principle of all life that the child was healed and remained healed.

One day Mrs. Eddy was going out for her afternoon drive when a tall, gaunt man, who appeared far gone in consumption, came up to her gate, held out his hands to her and shouted, "Help me!" Mrs. Eddy said a few words to him out of the carriage window, talked to him for about two minutes, and then drove on out of the gate. On her return she exclaimed, "What a need that man had." Next day she received a letter from the man telling Mrs. Eddy that he was conscious he had been healed as soon as the carriage drove on.

The Christian Science Weekly

On September 1, 1898, the Publishing Society published the first of what was to become the Christian Science Sentinel, as *The Christian Science Weekly*. The first article, "Salutatory," said, "The growing necessities of the situation seem to demand, at times, a speedier means of communication with the Field than our monthly *Journal* affords. . . . It will be a feature of the *Weekly* to supply, in each issue, a brief synopsis of the current events of the world, sufficient, perhaps, to keep the busy workers fairly well informed as to the more important facts of general interest."

The *Weekly* contained many news items of the day, including news of government and business, and even of "a grand parade of battleships on the North River, New York," returning from war. It included items from various newspapers, and sermons given by ministers in churches. There were also articles, letters, and testimonies submitted by Christian Scientists, and we plan to occasionally include some of these in future issues of the CornerStone.

The following inspiring testimony is the first to appear in the *Weekly*, and was re-published from the Christian Science Journal.

She Never Fell

C. E. M.

On the morning of the dedication of the Chicago church, November 14, 1897, I was in my bedroom in the third story of our house. I was getting ready to go to the morning service, and my little daughter, five years old, was playing about, when suddenly I felt a silence. I instantly noticed that the child was no longer there and that the window was open.

I looked out and saw her unconscious form on the

ground below, her head on the cement sidewalk. Instantly I thought, "All is Love."

As I went downstairs the entire paragraph in "No and Yes," p. 19, beginning, "Eternal harmony, perpetuity, and perfection constitute the phenomena of Being," came to me, and with it the clear sense of the great gulf fixed between the child and the lie that claimed to destroy. The child was brought in, and as she was carried upstairs she cried. As she was laid down, blood was spurting from her mouth and had already covered her neck and shoulders. I instantly said, "There is one law — God's law — under which man remains perfect," and the bleeding immediately stopped.

The child seemed to relapse into unconsciousness, but I declared, "Mind is ever present and controls Its idea," and in a few moments, she slept naturally. During the morning she seemed to suffer greatly if she was moved at all, and her legs seemed paralyzed. In the afternoon all sense of pain left, she slept quietly, and I went to the afternoon service, rejoicing greatly in my freedom from the sense of personal responsibility.

When I returned she sat in my lap to eat some supper, with no sense of pain, but still unable to control her limbs, which presented the appearance of entire inaction.

At eight o'clock, she was undressed without inconvenience, and there was no mark on her body but a bruised eye. During the day she had not spoken of herself. At eleven o'clock, when I went upstairs, I found her wide awake, and she said, "Mamma, error is trying to say that I fell out of the window, but that cannot be. The child of God can't fall; but why do I lie here? Why can't I move my legs?"

The answer was, "You can move them. Mind governs, and you are always perfect." In a moment she said, "I will

get up and walk." It seemed to require one or two trials to induce her legs to obey, but she rose, walked across the room and back, climbed into bed, stretched her legs out and said, "I knew error could not talk!" She then sat up, ate a lunch, fell into a natural slumber, and woke bright and happy in the morning.

For two days there was an uncertainty of movement, a seeming inability to walk in a straight line, but she moved about constantly, frequently rebuking the error aloud and declaring, "Love helps me walk."

On Wednesday, harmony was established. Some weeks after, her little sister said to her, "You did fall out of the window, didn't you?" But her reply was, "My body fell, but I am not in my body. Can God's child fall?" And the little three-year-old answered, "No, because God is good."

Someone has very aptly said, "There is no failure save in giving up." A large number of our seeming failures can be turned into glorious victories by persisting just a little longer in denying the evil and proclaiming the truth.

It makes no difference what the claim may be, how long the siege has been going on, or how desperate the struggle. The fact remains that evil is powerless, and when

persistently opposed by the truth, must yield in complete surrender.

The devil, who "knoweth that he hath but a short time," would suggest that our efforts have failed. That is nothing more than an acknowledgement of its *own* defeat! That is the time to go forward with greater courage and renewed persistency and clear the field of the enemy.

Persistence in the truth gives power and strength. It does not degenerate into mere stubbornness or blind obstinacy; neither is it expressed as human will-power.

Mary Baker Eddy points out the fact that "there is no excellence without labor," and that "the time to work is *now*." (Mis.) And she adds, "Only by persistent, unremitting, straightforward toil; by turning neither to the right nor to the left, seeking no other pursuit or pleasure than that which cometh from God, can you win and wear the crown of the faithful."

Then take courage and work bravely on. The way of escape through the open door of Christian Science is for all. Whoever will, may pass through this gateway into the freedom, joy, and power of a child of God.



Arise Up Quickly

The human mind is prone to procrastinate. Even when people have learned something of the power of Truth, they still often think they have to wait for the fulfillment of their hopes.

In the account of Peter's release from prison, the mes-

sage from the angel was, "Arise up quickly." Peter was not loosed from his chains, and then told to wait until daylight to rise up and walk out. Divine Love saw no chains; and there was nothing to keep Peter from immediate obedience.

There is no provision in the divine plan for procrastination in healing. The "word of God is quick," as well as "powerful." The healings of Jesus were, almost without exception, instantaneous. How could they be otherwise? Does not Isaiah say, "The spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him . . . and shall make him of quick understanding"? Shouldn't we also possess this "quick understanding"?

One of our difficulties is that we think we must wait. Jesus did not wait for the tribute money. He knew instantly

where to find it. He once said to his disciples, "Agree with thine adversary quickly, whiles thou art in the way with him," or, as Mary Baker Eddy puts it, "'Agree to disagree' with approaching symptoms of chronic or acute disease." (S&H) This applies to discord of every kind. We are never to wait for the "ad-

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versary" to present its arguments and suggestions — we are to immediately annul these suggestions!

In order to do this, we must continually "stand porter at the door of thought." (S&H) If we guard that door faithfully, and admit only godlike thoughts, we find ourselves free from "chains" that would bind us and hinder our instant obedience to the voice of Truth. Then we are able to not only cast out, but prevent the entrance of any thought that would tempt us to believe in a power apart from God—in any power that can hold back the instant realization of health, joy, and peace.

Watching Point No. 94 Gilbert C. Carpenter

WATCH lest you be tempted to powder your face instead of to wash it. One method hides the dirt; the other removes it. If you bring out what the world calls harmony and morality in your life, without having changed the fundamental cause of discord, namely, material thinking, you are deceiving yourself and others. You are working with effect without correcting cause. It is like holding a match to the thermometer in a cold room, so that it registers an artificial warmth. True reform or healing is brought out only through spiritualization of thought. Mere changes in effect, or exchanging one belief for another, accomplish little, unless the changes are brought about through demonstration, and represent improving belief.

Watching Point No. 115 Gilbert C. Carpenter

WATCH lest you unthinkingly accept the purpose of Christian Science to be merely healing the sick, without growing in your understanding of what true healing is. According to the higher concept, healing is not a change from a sick body to a well body; it is giving up a false conception of man for the right idea, namely, God's idea of man. True healing does not seek to make mortal man harmonious in hell; it is dissipating the mist of falsity that hides reality. First we heal man in matter; then we heal him of matter.

Its "Clear, Correct Teaching" and Complete Writings by Herbert W. Eustace C.S.B.

This book is now available through the Plainfield Christian Science Church, Independent. It is an invaluable study aid for advancing students of Christian Science, containing many of the articles written by Mr. Eustace during his practice and teaching of Christian Science.

Mr. Eustace graduated from the Massachusetts Metaphysical College in 1902 with the degree of C.S.B., signed by Mrs. Eddy and Mr. Edward Kimball. After that, Mr. Eustace served the Christian Science movement faithfully for many years, as Trustee of the Christian Science Publishing Society, practitioner, and teacher of Christian Science well into the 1930s.

The following paragraphs, handwritten by Mr. Eustace, were left on his desk as his last written word (December 9, 1957):

"Mrs. Eddy gave two very important directions to every Christian Scientist before saying good-bye; in fact they were more than directions, they were commands and demanded imperative obedience. The one was to call disease animal magnetism as the specific term for error or mortal mind, and then handle animal magnetism. And the other was that Christian Scientists are not healing because they do not know how to handle animal magnetism.

"Here is a challenge to you. Do you not know how to handle animal magnetism? If not, why not; and from this moment let your every intent be to know how to handle animal magnetism and then do it; and heal the sick intelligently and instantaneously, which is the only way Christian Science does."

The book is bound in flexible red leatherette and contains 1040 pages. The price is \$27.00.

And there was no day like that before it or after it, that the Lord hearkened unto the voice of a man: for the Lord fought for Israel." (Jos.)

This to me conveys the humbling power of God. It makes "God is All" more than a "head in the clouds" statement!

Comment:

I love this story. Was this a matter of God doing whatever Joshua asked Him to do? Joshua needed more daylight, so he asked God to give it to him? No. Joshua went

into battle in the first place in obedience to God. God promised to deliver the Amorites. It was a matter of error being destroyed by God, good. It was divine Principle in operation.

When the battle took longer than a full day, God provided the daylight. It may have seemed to some of the people that Joshua was telling the sun and moon to stand still — but it was the law of God causing the earth to stop rotating for a day. Joshua merely reported to the Israelites what was going on, as it was revealed to him, so that everyone would know that God was in control of the battle.

This is a great example of humility and obedience. "Obedience to Truth gives man power and strength." (S&H)

Comment:

In a box of papers belonging to Herbert Eustace given to us by the Eustace foundation, there is a scientific article giving proof that this actually did happen (if anyone needs scientific proof!). There is a missing day in time that cannot be logically accounted for.

I love the following story about Mrs. Eddy: she once told a student, "Whenever I need something I ask the Father and He gives it to me." It was her utmost obedience and love for Him that allowed this to so freely happen, as it was with Joshua.

Comment:

The sun standing still for "almost" a day seems to be accounted for in astronomical annals. Actually, it was 23 hours and 20 minutes. The remainder of the "missing" day in the records would be made up by the 40 minutes lost astronomically when King Hezekiah asked for the "shadow of the sun" to recess 10 degrees backward, so he could escape

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a death sentence. (II Kings 20: 9-11) The Joshua story was promulgated by a certain Harold Hill, President of the Curtis Engine Cp., who purportedly was a NASA consultant when he encountered the "missing" day. These examples are certainly on a par with the parting of The Red Sea in Exodus, and other instances of Divine intervention.

Missing Day Found Bible Solves Scientific Dilemma

Did you know that the space program is busy proving that what has been called "myth" in the Bible, is true? An official of a well-known Baltimore business firm and consultant in the space program, relates the following development.

"I think one of the most amazing things that God has for us today happened recently to our astronauts and space scientists at Green Belt, Maryland. They were checking the position of the sun, moon, and planets out in space — where they would be 100 years and 1,000 years from now. We have to know this so we don't send a satellite up and have it bump into something later, on one of its orbits. We have to lay out the orbit in terms of the life of the satel-

lite and where the planets will be in order that the whole thing will not bog down.

"They ran the computer measurement back and forth over the centuries and it came to a halt. The computer stopped and put up a red signal, which meant that there was something wrong, either with the information fed into it or with the results as compared to the standards. They called the service department to check it out; and they said, after checking the computer, 'It's perfect.' The IBM head of operations asked, 'What's wrong?' 'Well, we have found there is a day missing in space in elapsed time,' the scientists replied. They scratched their heads and tore their hair. There was no answer.

"One religious fellow on the team said, 'You know, when I was in Sunday School they talked about the sun standing still.' No one believed him, but they didn't have any other answer, so they said, 'Show us.' So he got a Bible and went back to the book of Joshua 10:8-14. There they found that Joshua was concerned because he was surrounded by the enemy, and if darkness fell, they would overpower him and the children of Israel. So Joshua asked the Lord to make the sun stand still! That's right! 'The sun stood still and the moon stayed . . . and hasted not to go down about a whole day.' The space men exclaimed, 'There is the missing day!'

"Well, they checked the computers going back into the time it was written and found it was close, but not close enough. The elapsed time that was missing back in Joshua's day was 23 hours and 20 minutes — not a whole day. They referred to the Bible again, and there it said 'about a day.'

"These little words in the Bible are important. But they were still in trouble because if you cannot account for 40

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minutes, you'll be in trouble 1,000 years from now. Forty minutes had to be found because it can be multiplied many times over in orbit. Well, this religious fellow also remembered somewhere in the Bible where it said, 'the sun went backwards.' The space men told him he was out of his mind. They got out the Good Book once more, and found those words in II Kings 20:9-11. Hezekiah, on his deathbed, was visited by the prophet Isaiah, who told him the Lord had sent word through him that he was not going to die. Hezekiah did not believe Isaiah and asked for a sign as proof. Isaiah said, 'Do you want the sun to go ahead ten degrees?' Hezekiah said, 'It's nothing for the sun to go ahead ten degrees, but let the shadow return backward ten degrees.' Isaiah spoke to the Lord and the Lord brought the shadow ten degrees backward! Ten degrees is exactly 40 minutes! Twenty-three hours and 20 minutes in Joshua, plus 40 minutes in II Kings, makes the missing 24 hours they had to enter into the log book as being the missing day in the universe. Isn't that amazing?

One of the most profound differences I've noticed since being led to the Plainfield Church is the quality of practi-

tioner support I have received. I can honestly say it is unique to this church.

As someone who was raised in Christian Science and class taught, I have had the opportunity to speak with, and work with, a number of practitioners in the movement. While there was no shortage of kindness or love from these dear folks, looking back from my vantage point today, I see there was something vital missing from most of their treatments and instruction to me — it was a failure to understand and uncover how animal magnetism was at work in the particular situation, and to see how it was working in my thought in order to uncover and remove whatever needed to be addressed there.

In the past, when I read early Christian Science articles or testimonies, I noted that often patients described how the practitioner had uncovered something within their thoughts or lives that needed handling — maybe a sense of hatred, or an unprincipled action. In one instance I read of a healing of a man where the healing came only after a false influence regarding his mother had been identified and removed from the man's thought (even though his mother had passed on). He had to eliminate a false sense of a mother/son relationship that had been very prideful, human, and clingy. The handling of that erroneous element of thought brought the immediate healing.

Reading things like this made me occasionally wonder why the practitioners I worked with didn't crack me open and help me yank out all the "tares" in my consciousness, but I still didn't question their methods. I figured they knew what they were doing better than I. However, when I was lead to Plainfield, I realized I had found people who really knew their stuff! Within a few days of working with a practitioner in this church, several things that were unprincipled (although they seemed humanly good and reasonable

to my untrained thought) were identified, and a false sense of pride and family was uncovered.

Since then, I have been also grateful for the time and effort both practitioners have made to really get to know me and to help me see how this Science isn't just a mental medicine we pull off the shelf and apply to our problems, as needed. They've stressed that Science must be lived, day by day and minute by minute, and if it's not lived and embodied in ALL aspects of our lives, then we aren't in a position of protection or strength. I never once got that from anyone outside of Plainfield!

I am so grateful for this new insight into Christian Science and for being a part of a church that is striving to live this Science and practice it the way Mrs. Eddy and her students did. It continues to make a real difference in my life.

Featured Worker: Annie Knott

There is a fine biographical sketch of Annie Knott in "Paths of Pioneer Christian Scientists," published by the Longyear Museum. Briefly, Mrs. Knott did great healing work, established the church in Detroit, lectured, taught, was editor of the periodicals, and had the distinction of being the first woman on the Board of Directors of the Mother Church.

Here, we will depart from the standard biographical material and use this great worker to illustrate why Mary Baker Eddy went to such great lengths to terminate the centralized power of the Board of Directors of the Mother Church after her passing (thoroughly documented in "Mary Baker Eddy's Church Manual," by Helen Wright). As final authority in her church from its inception, Mrs. Eddy was fully aware of the "animal magnetism" or evil she had to overcome in maintaining a spiritual organization. She observed that even her best students could not fathom what she was up against. She was constantly admonishing, encouraging, and guiding her Board of Directors so that they would not yield to the temptation to use human will instead of relying on divine guidance in governing this worldwide movement.

After Mrs. Eddy passed, the Board of Directors defied Mrs. Eddy's clear instructions in the Church Manual to disband as the "head of the church." They were sure that Mrs. Eddy had been mistaken, and that the movement could not possibly survive without their governorship. When they became increasingly overbearing in controlling the movement, the Board of Trustees challenged their authority in what became the Great Litigation. During this time, in 1919, Mrs. Knott, who had served for years in the Publishing House under the jurisdiction of the Board of

Trustees, was invited to serve on the Board of Directors. Shortly thereafter, she was subpoenaed to testify in court regarding Mrs. Eddy's intent for her church. She stated:

"Mrs. Eddy said she wanted to have the Mother Church modeled as closely as possible after the early Christian church and after Jesus' teachings, and the Church to be as free as possible from the trammels of material organization."

When the appeal to the Supreme Court of Massachusetts reversed the initial decision of the Court, Mrs. Knott celebrated that the Board of Directors were deemed allpowerful according to the Manual and Mrs. Eddy's intent(!), insuring a top-heavy, centralized church government! Furthermore, as a Board member herself, she was complicit in the character assassination and excommunication of Herbert Eustace and the other two Trustees. That such a fine worker as Mrs. Knott could be so handled by animal magnetism when under the duress of acting as a Board member, should be sufficient explanation as to why Mrs. Eddy restricted the Board's powerful role after she was no longer around to hold it in check. Without her, the Board was not fit to guide the content of lectures, and teaching, etc. The branch churches were to be autonomous, as in the early Christian church, where each church would thrive or wilt depending upon their faithfulness to the true concept. (See definition of Church in textbook glossary.) The great legacy of Mrs. Knott is not diminished by the recognition of her participation in the notorious Board of Directors. Rather, the unfailing wisdom of Mary Baker Eddy, against the huge army of her detractors, is acknowledged and celebrated.



Featured Worker: Annie Knott

Excerpt from "Paths of Pioneer Christian Scientists" Christopher L. Tyner

The year 1898 marked a watershed in Mrs. Knott's work and career as a Christian Scientist. Up to that time, her primary focus had been on gaining an understanding of Christian Science and demonstrating what she had learned by healing the sick and sinning. By 1898 her practice was thriving, and she was busy teaching classes and tending to the needs of her students.

In this critical year Mary Baker Eddy was taking measures to strengthen the Christian Science movement: she established the Board of Lectureship; created The Christian Science Publishing Society in its present form; designated the topics for the Lesson-Sermons; launched the weekly religious periodical Christian Science Sentinel; taught her last class; and took steps to create the Committee on Publication.

In June Mrs. Eddy requested that Mrs. Knott join the Board of Lectureship. This proved to be the first in a series of appointments that would propel Mrs. Knott from her singular focus on her beloved Detroit vineyard into "a wider sphere of thought and action." (S&H) Mrs. Eddy spoke to her on the subject of lecturing, and Mrs. Knott found herself drawing on Mrs. Eddy's wisdom soon thereafter. Mrs. Eddy indicated that she should prepare her lectures "carefully," submit a copy to the Board of Directors, and yet be flexible enough to address the unique needs that might arise in a specific moment in the lecture hall. "You must look for your inspiration in what God gives you at the time," Mrs. Eddy told her, "not in what is manufactured."

Fairly new to this activity, Mrs. Knott began a lecture on Christian Science one evening in Salt Lake City, unaware that sitting in the audience was a hypnotist intent on throwing her off track. The hypnotist had come to Salt Lake

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City to teach a class on how to control people's thinking. After learning that a Christian Science Lecturer (Mrs. Knott) was in town to speak, he decided to cancel his scheduled class and attend the lecture instead, to make an object lesson in mental manipulation for his students.

Although Mrs. Knott had been told a hypnotist was in town, she knew nothing of his plan to target her specifically. But as she spiritually prepared for this lecture, she felt "somewhat troubled." However, once the lecture was under way she had a "marvelous illumination," and obeying Mrs. Eddy's admonition to rely on divine guidance, she departed from her prepared remarks and discussed the difference between Christian Science and hypnotism.

"I never had given a lecture with such a wonderful sense of freedom," Mrs. Knott wrote about this lecture, "and when I returned to the room where I was staying, I wrote down what I could remember of my own remarks, the strong point being the one Mind as ever present."

It would be several months before Mrs. Knott would discover the full story behind what had taken place that night. The person who revealed the story to Mrs. Knott had been in Salt Lake City that night and knew a student of this hypnotist. The hypnotist had told those interested in learning hypnotism that if they attended the Christian Science lecture that evening, they could witness him knock the lecturer of her track. "She would most likely become so confused that she would hardly know her own name if asked," this hypnotist was reported to have said. But when he came into the hall and tried to disorient Mrs. Knott, he quickly realized he was getting nowhere. He later explained to his students that someone must have tipped the lecturer off to his plan. The fact was, Mrs. Knott was unaware that he would attend her lecture. She later observed that if she had been told, she might have been troubled. "But when the adverse mental influence was felt," Mrs. Knott wrote, "I never before had been so clear, for it was as if God was telling me how to

defend our Cause, and for months, all the work which followed this remarkable illumination was with me to a large extent."

Mrs. Knott would face a new depth, when her beloved nineteen-year-old daughter Nellie passed on. "In spite of all I could do," she wrote Mrs. Eddy, "my darling and I parted, though I am sure only for a little while."

"The wild waves of sorrow swept over me, but only to make me realize more than ever the solid rock beneath my feet, and with the peace of Christ I was able to lift higher than ever the sense of my students....

"My daughter was the dearest of all on earth to me, so sweet and fair, caring only to share my cares and trials — loyally and truly devoted to our great cause."

Mrs. Eddy's heartfelt response was a remarkable letter of both comfort and power, stating a promise of what was possible.

"Well dear one, you have no cause to doubt God's love for you and your child. And if He loves you He doeth all things that is for your good. But He does not destroy the work of His hands. You alone and all mortals are responsible for mortal conditions. They make them and they yield them up. Why do they give up what is so dear to them? Because they know not yet how to retain them as reality.

"Therefore wait on God and Love will teach you how, and do not mourn over the lessons of Love but rejoice. For Love knows best, and you and I wait to learn what is best."

Mrs. Eddy signed this letter, "Lovingly thine in sorrow or in joy, Mother, M.B. Eddy."

Mrs. Knott had a typed duplicate of this letter, to which she added and initialed the poignant comment: "This means more than any other. A.M.K."

Are Miracles Relevant to Me?

God gave Sarah a child at the age of ninety-one. Jesus healed a man who was blind from his birth, walked on water, raised Lazarus from the grave, and raised himself from three days in the tomb. God parted the Red Sea for Moses and the Israelites, caused the sun to stand still for about a day for Joshua to defeat the Amorites. In Job we read, "Stand still and consider the wondrous works of God."

It is a very useful exercise to ask ourselves, "How do I consider these wondrous works of God?" Do I consider them freaks of nature? Are they experiences that only a few "chosen" can ever experience? If so, who gets chosen and why? Are they too weird or other-worldly for me to even consider relevant to my life? Are they violations of natural law?

Or do I consider them the fulfillment of divine law, which does apply to me, even though I may not fully understand it? Mrs. Eddy defines "miracle": "That which is divinely natural, but must be learned humanly; a phenomenon of Science." In his teaching, Jesus is quoted as saying, "Think not that I am come to destroy the law, or the prophets: I am not come to destroy, but to fulfil." Both Jesus and Mrs. Eddy refer to these miraculous acts as the fulfillment of divine law. Mrs. Eddy herself experienced the healing of an incurable condition by reading the Bible, and spent the next three years working to discover the law, or Science, behind hers and all the Biblical healings. What she discovered was that there is a law of God that made the universe, including mankind. That law is spiritual, moral, and not material.

Too often, people slough off miracles as just plain unexplainable. Yet, if we "stand still and consider the wondrous works of God," we can see that these "miracles" point to the law of God that created the universe and cares for His children. Jesus promised that "If ye believe in me, ye shall never see death." That's a pretty strong promise! By this promise, Jesus was referring to the law of God that he was teaching and demonstrating for mankind, and which very few people got!

The Christian Science textbook, Science and Health, with Key to the Scriptures, by Mary Baker Eddy, explains how this divine law is relevant to each of us. It explains that miracles are relevant to every one of us, pointing to law that governs us, provides for us in every way, healing us of our sins and our ills. It brings the Bible to life, making it the "chart of life" that God intended.
