Mental activity must be tranquil — not lazy; it must express force, and it must know the reality of man's oneness with God, and the utter unreality of evil in all its forms of belief. Know that your treatments are good ones, and have no fear that they are not. A Christian Science treatment is never afraid it will not work.

Every pure thought falling silently and gently into human consciousness does its part in cleansing the whole world, just as every falling snowflake does its silent share in transforming the noisomeness of the grimy earth into a soft white blanket of purity. We must remember that the smallest truth is mightier than the greatest lie the world has ever known. The one is as enduring as eternity; the other is as transient as a shadow. Take from a lie its power to deceive and it becomes nothing.

My Visit to Chestnut Hill

I was recently called for a work assignment in Chestnut Hill, Boston, near Longyear Museum. During my last week there, I had the opportunity to visit the Museum and also toured the last house Mrs. Eddy lived in before her passing in 1910.

The tour started with about six people, two of whom were not Christian Scientists but were interested in this great woman who did so many wonderful things in her time. The house is a grand, granite, rather imposing mansion. I was not surprised to see the very large kitchen, oversized parlors, and the faded beauty of some of the original wallpapers and carpets.

Most of us were anxious to see Mrs. Eddy's bedroom. We toured the different rooms: the large dining room, the studies and rooms of the secretaries. Calvin Frye's (who worked faithfully for 28 years) room and study were of particular interest to me, because I read in some of the biographies that Mrs. Eddy would at times call on some of her most spiritually minded workers to work metaphysically to support her when faced with certain challenges. Calvin Frye was often called upon to do such work; so it was interesting to see that his room was in closest proximity to Mrs. Eddy's.

The lounge chaise she used in the evenings when she would look out and pray for the world was still in a room on the second floor, with large windows facing east. The dining room, other rooms used by Mrs. Eddy's personal attendant, other workers and even the room where the seamstress made clothes for Mrs. Eddy and other household members, all gave a vivid insight into the daily life of this extraordinary woman.

The room of most interest and the one that had the

most reaction from everyone was Mrs. Eddy's bedroom. It was the size that got everyone talking. To see that in this huge mansion, her bedroom could only fit a bed and a dresser spoke volumes! Most of us questioned this and made our own conclusions. But what later dawned on me was the spiritual significance of the size of the room: All I could feel was that here was a truly selfless woman whose mission had never been to satisfy self. She gave up all for Christ; to the extent that even in her later years when money was abundant in her life, the size of her room summed up what her heart was after; laboring in complete obedience to God, not for self, but for the glory of God and to bless mankind.

My eyes well up thinking about her spirituality and the depth of her love for God and man. The tour brought the deepest respect, admiration, and love for Mrs. Eddy, for what she stood and fought for to bring the Comforter to mankind.

Such was her sacrifice; it makes me question what I am to do as my God-given part in this holy mission for God and mankind.

One Man's Search for God

An article in the first issue of the Christian Science Weekly, by Charles Edward Riedlinger, tells of his journey to find Truth and God. His search began with the Roman Catholic church of his mother, which caused him "much mental anguish." He studied all the Protestant churches, ending with the Congregational church. He "drifted into the religions of the Orient, and found them barren." He studied Theosophy and Spiritualism, then, discouraged, turned to hypnotism.

At this point in his life, he came upon Science and Health, read it from cover to cover, and exclaimed, "This is Truth! I will follow." He writes, "As I look back over those years, I am glad for their experience, for out of much tribulation have I learned God.

"Spiritualism would keep us in subjection to many spirits, good and evil, while Christian Science holds us in one divine Love. Hypnotism would communicate and force suggestion into its subject, while Christian Science knows that we are all the reflection of the one perfect Mind, hence we need not transmit suggestions of health and harmony, for they are man's *natural* habitat, and need only be discovered to him. Theosophy would have us waste our time in speculation on future lives, whereas Christian Science is a *present* help, and by it we live this life so that the future may take care of itself.

The following short article, reproduced from an issue of the New York Journal, appeared in the second issue of the Christian Science Weekly. It shows nothing is impossible to God!

TRENTON, N.J., August 1, 1898.—Mrs. Lydia Parsons, the ninety-nine-year-old woman who is showing signs of returning youth, goes right on growing young. "I used to be a rheumatic once in a while when the weather got damp, but I've got all over that now. I never have an aching bone, any more, and I can walk as easily as I ever could." For nearly twenty years, Mrs. Parsons wore spectacles, and the lenses were strong. Even then it was with difficulty that she read the Bible, to which she is warmly devoted. Suddenly her evesight returned, and she is able to read without glasses as easily as she could when she was a girl. Real Christian Science

I was raised in Christian Science, served in branch churches, took class instruction from a well-regarded teacher—everything I thought I was supposed to do to understand what it takes to be a "good" Christian Scientist and an effective healer.

A horrible personal crisis showed me that all of the above had left me utterly unequipped and ignorant of the real Science Mrs. Eddy discovered. The Boston-based practitioners and teachers also weren't up to the task of helping me. It wasn't until I found Plainfield Church that I started to see everything that had been missing.

Most of the people in the mainstream movement just ignore the error and leave it unhandled. But where does Mrs. Eddy tell us to make peace with the devil (evil)? I am grateful for the teaching I get in this church — especially when it's juxtaposed against what the Boston Christian Science culture teaches — because it keeps me on the straight and narrow path!

Right Practice

Years ago, prior to my coming to the Plainfield Church, I was diagnosed with a thyroid condition. I called a Journal-listed practitioner for help; and while the lady was exceedingly nice, I remember feeling very put off by the pity in her voice. She was clearly trying to be compassionate, but all it did was make me feel absolutely miserable, and there was definitely no bite or fire when it came to dealing with the physical issue. Because of my discontent, I ended up leaving that practitioner and working with other Journal-listed practitioners, but the condition had to be treated medically before I found relief.

After I came to the Plainfield Church and started working with a Plainfield practitioner, the difference was tangible. For example, last week I called my Plainfield practitioner after experiencing some pains while doing the nightly church watch. While he was pleasant enough on the phone, he was absolutely fierce in handling the error. He said that it was an aggressive mental suggestion claiming to be something, when it was actually nothing. Under no circumstances did I need to accept this suggestion as reality, and then turn around and try to heal it — which is absolutely ludicrous. Mrs. Eddy emphasizes repeatedly the importance of handling aggressive mental suggestion wherever it may be found, and she, herself, was a constant terror to error — clearly following the Master's example.

I am very grateful to have access to such a high quality of teaching and practitioner help here in the Plainfield Church. I can honestly say that had I not been led to Plainfield, I would have drifted far away from the Christian Science movement by now.

Overview of Mary Baker Eddy's Message for 1901 Andrew Kidd

In reading aloud and recording Mary Baker Eddy's Message for 1901 (found in Prose Works) in the holy atmosphere of our church auditorium, it became clear that so little of what our Leader has left us is actually reaching her students. In an effort to correct this, and to encourage a closer look, we will select one item from her Prose Works and highlight it in each issue of the Cornerstone — beginning with her Message for 1901. Here are some key points:

1. Addressing the misconception that, with the Bible and Science and Health as our Pastor, the Christian Scientist has no personal preacher:

"To my sense the Sermon on the Mount, read each Sunday without comment and obeyed throughout the week, would be enough for Christian practice. The Word of God is a powerful preacher, and it is not too spiritual to be practical, nor too transcendental to be heard and understood. Whosoever saith there is no sermon without personal preaching, forgets what Christian Scientists do not, namely, that God is a Person, and that he should be willing to hear a sermon from his personal God!"

2. Addressing the Christian world's great discomfort with the position that evil is unreal:

"Do Christian Scientists believe that evil exists? We answer, Yes and No! Yes, inasmuch as we do know that evil, as a false claim, false entity, and utter falsity, does exist in thought; and No, as something that enjoys, suffers, or is *real*. Our only departure from ecclesiasticism on this subject is, that our faith takes hold of the fact that evil cannot be made so real as to frighten us and so master us, or to make us love it and so hinder our way to holiness. We re-

gard evil as a lie, an illusion, therefore as unreal as a mirage that misleads the traveler on his way home."

3. Admonishing those students who are too quick to declare that evil is unreal:

"The evil-doer receives no encouragement from my declaration that evil is unreal, when I declare that he must awake from his belief in this awful unreality, repent and forsake it, in order to understand and demonstrate its unreality. Error uncondemned is not nullified. We must condemn the claim of error in every phase in order to prove it false, therefore unreal."

4. Warning how deadly it is to indulge in misleading others:

"The mental malpractitioner is not, cannot be, a Christian Scientist; he is disloyal to God and man; he has every opportunity to mislead the human mind, and he uses it. People may listen complacently to the suggestion of the inaudible falsehood, not knowing what is hurting them or that they are hurt. This mental bane could not bewilder, darken, or misguide consciousness, physically, morally, or spiritually, if the individual knew what was at work and his power over it.

"This unseen evil is the sin of sins; it is never forgiven."

As we look more closely at Mrs. Eddy's body of work, we find this great woman constantly admonishing her students for their lack of handling sin in themselves, and clarifying misunderstandings, and then defending herself and her Revelation from the perpetual attacks from the baser elements outside the Christian Science movement. As we are more attuned to this, we will gain so much more practical knowledge in our striving to practice Christian Science.

The following is a sample of submissions from the Lesson, "Substance."

After Gideon and his men defeated the Midianites, the children of Israel wanted Gideon to be their king. "And Gideon said unto them, I will not rule over you, neither shall my son rule over you: the Lord shall rule over you." Jud. 8:23

Gideon acknowledges God's power in their victory over the Midianites, gives glory to God, and assures his people of God's everlasting government. A great lesson that, at all times and under all circumstances, I must trust that God alone rules. Trusting this has brought amazing outcomes in my human experience. It's wonderful when rulers know that there is indeed one Supreme Ruler!

Response:

So glad you pointed this out. Here we are getting ready to elect a new president, and there is much fear about the future of our country. Let's replace the fear with reliance on God and his governing power. There is only one Mind.

Response:

I thought it was fascinating that, after the battle in which only 300 men defeated the Midianite army, the men of Israel still didn't get it. They still wanted a man to rule over them.

It made me think of the Christian Science organization. After Mrs. Eddy passed, too many were all too willing to let the Board of Directors in Boston rule over them (and they, in this case, were willing to accept the offer). Mrs. Eddy foresaw this and designed the Manual, with its estoppel clauses, to prevent it. Every Christian Scientist should be as bold as Gideon — refusing to rule or be ruled by man! We can certainly be so grateful to Mrs. Eddy for everything she has given to mankind.

Speaking of presidents, I have read that at the end of the Revolutionary War, several people wanted to make George Washington a king, rather than create a republic. Washington, however, like Gideon, refused. He had seen the power of God operate in his life, especially with the winning of a war that seemed absolutely hopeless at times, and he knew, better than others, that it was time to create a government based on the rule of law. It was a huge step in the history of mankind toward the rule by God. We should be so grateful to our founding fathers for their wisdom and Christian character that created our Constitution and Declaration of Independence! It provided the legal protection that was necessary for the discovery and founding of Christian Science by Mrs. Eddy.

"And the Lord said unto Gideon, The people that are with thee are too many for me to give the Midianites into their hands, lest Israel vaunt themselves against me, saying, Mine own hand hath saved me."

The Independent Lesson Forum

I totally love this story of Gideon! The human mind so much wants to claim all the credit and leave God (who has done it all!) out of the picture. So when the odds are completely stacked against you, when there is *no* way you can claim a smidgeon of success without God's help, when you are feeling totally helpless without Him — that is the time He can come in and take charge with absolute authority and victory! "Thine, O Lord is the greatness, and the power, and the glory and the victory"! And that is the only place where any real victory ever lies!

Response:

Perhaps this is the biggest danger of the medical — by his/her own admission, a good doctor recognizes that he only aids, encourages, lessens fear, patches up — the real healing is through God. But look at the hysteria surrounding drug taking, health insurance, etc. — where is God? It is common for an employee to be more concerned about health benefits than any other aspect of his working conditions!!! This is an indication of a society lost in the fear of Godlessness.

This is the vacuum that true, honest Christian Science is here to fill. We have our work to do, but as illustrated in this story of Gideon, "if God be for us, who can be against us." We are His servants. He is the doer!

Response:

The Bible says that "man's extremity is God's opportunity." Unfortunately, too often folks are not ready to rely on God until it becomes obvious that only with God's help can the victory possibly be achieved. Imagine the good that could be accomplished if we consistently turned to God first and not wait till the point of extremity.

Soon after I came to Plainfield, while working with a practitioner, I remember being told, "It took you a long time to get into this situation, so it might take a while to get

out of it — just don't give up!" I remember saying later that I felt like an onion being peeled, that layer after layer of error was being peeled away. And as I persisted, one by one, bad habits of thought and bad experiences fell away.

The practitioner also told me that embarking on the study of Christian Science is like sailing a ship up a freshwater river, where the barnacles that cling to the ship's bottom in the ocean, fall off in the fresh waters. Seeker Versus Striver

"I have grown up in Christian Science and often find such clarity when I study, but cannot seem to apply it, as I am constantly bombarded with negative experiences." This is a common chorus among "life-long Christian Scientists." We do not have to look far for an explanation of this condition in our textbook, Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures:

"Students of Christian Science, who start with its letter and think to succeed without the spirit, will either make shipwreck of their faith or be turned sadly awry. They must not only seek, but strive, to enter the narrow path of Life, for 'wide is the gate, and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in thereat.' Man walks in the direction towards which he looks, and where his treasure is, there will his heart be also. If our hopes and affections are spiritual, they come from above, not from beneath, and they bear as of old the fruits of the Spirit." (S&H p. 451)

What is this spirit that is too often lacking? Seeking truth and understanding is not adequate. Striving is absolutely required — striving to overcome the flesh in its warfare with the spirit! The modern-day systems of metaphysics, like Unity, New Age, etc., are uncomfortable with this point. To these systems, the Bible with its allusions to the war of the spirit and the flesh, is primitive and tiresome, and the writings of Mrs. Eddy obsess about animal magnetism!! Why strive when it is so much easier simply to seek? Sadly, the Christian Science "culture" (not Mrs. Eddy's legacy), has found affinity with this "wide gate and broad way," and this explains why it is void of transformative, healing power.

How then does one strive? In the passage under consideration, it stipulates that our hopes and affections must be spiritual — our desire to know God and to obey Him must overtake our desire for peace and harmony. Then, from Mrs. Eddy's article "Exemplification": "To energize wholesome spiritual warfare, to rebuke vainglory, to offset boastful emptiness, to crown patient toil, and rejoice in the spirit and power of Christian Science, we must ourselves be true. . . . Note well the falsity of this mortal self! Behold its vileness, and remember this poverty-stricken 'stranger that is within thy gates.' Cleanse every stain from this wanderer's soiled garments, wipe the dust from his feet and the tears from his eyes, that you may behold the real man, the fellow-saint of a holy household. There should be no blot on the escutcheon of our Christliness when we offer our gift upon the altar." (Ret. p. 86)

"Note well the falsity of this mortal self." — The seeker pretends the mortal self is perfect instead of striving to put it off. The striver declares: "Perfect God, perfect man, and that's not it!" and diligently refuses to indulge the mortal self. He welcomes the opportunity to have the light shine on his words and works so that whatever is not of God be uncovered in order to be healed. This is not a comfortable path, but it strengthens moral fiber, and allows the individual to be more watchful, and more consistently attentive to the needs of others. Then his peace and harmony will not be that fragile, other-worldly sense that is incapable of dealing with adversity, but it will be built upon a rock which the winds and waves will not be able to move.

On pages 232-233 in Science and Health, Mrs. Eddy states, "There is neither place nor opportunity in Science for error of any sort. Every day makes its demands upon us for higher proofs rather than professions of Christian power. Mrs. Eddy's wise counsel stands as a constant reminder of what true progress is! Loving goals that fill our days with genuine and worthwhile achievement!
