Featured Early Worker: Augusta Stetson

To many of us, if we had heard of Augusta Stetson, it was not in a favorable light. We heard that she was an early worker in the Christian Science movement who enjoyed enormous success, established the First Church in New York City, and then turned to the dark side and had to be excommunicated from the organization. But we also heard that Mary Baker Eddy had a deep and enduring love for Mrs. Stetson right to the end. How could this be? The assumption has been that, since Mrs. Eddy allowed the board of directors (b.o.d.) to proceed with the excommunication, she must have felt it necessary!

However, today, now that we have discovered the b.o.d. was far from supportive of Mrs. Eddy during her final years, that they summarily ignored her estoppel clauses in the Church Manual after her passing, ignored her warnings that the Church Manual was divinely guided! — now, knowing that whatever impressions we may have of Mrs. Stetson and her disgrace has been the result of thorough indoctrination by the all-powerful board of directors! — now we take a look at Mrs. Stetson in a different light. We do not attempt to summarize the thorough documentation which may be found on the website: http://www.emmapublishing.com. Instead, we compare the Mrs. Stetson that Mrs. Eddy knew with the one her detractors saw.

Mrs. Eddy loved Mrs. Stetson dearly, as is clear from their copious and heart-felt correspondence. No one else enjoyed such a close relationship with Mrs. Eddy. An early experience in their relationship left a deep impression with Mrs. Eddy. She did not appear at a scheduled speaking engagement and Mrs. Stetson, as a fairly new student, was in a position to either cancel the proceedings, or get up and

give the lecture herself. She chose the latter and, without preparation, spoke for an hour and a half, apparently very effectively! Later, Mrs. Eddy often referred to that experience when urging her on: "You did not run then. You never will." This quality of boldness, a spiritual strength, Mrs. Eddy recognized as rare and valuable to the furthering of her Cause. On the other hand, this same quality alienated Mrs. Stetson from others. They were offended by her brashness. When Mrs. Eddy sent her to establish the First Church in New York, other of Mrs. Eddy's own students distanced themselves from Mrs. Stetson, and started other churches. They did not want to have to deal with her strong, dominating character.

In another area, Mrs. Stetson was a regular purveyor of excellent fruit, fine clothing not available in Boston, and other expensive gifts to Mrs. Eddy, who happily accepted them. Despite being acutely sensitive to the thought behind gift-giving, Mrs. Eddy felt no strings-attached love from Mrs. Stetson's generosity, a spiritual giving. On the other hand, Mrs. Stetson's detractors found her to be grossly material, her church lavish, and her appreciation of expensive, beautiful things offensive to the spiritually minded!

Finally, Mrs. Eddy shared her vision of a spiritual organization with Mrs. Stetson, and as far we as we know, with no one else. After years of struggling with her board of directors, whom she once castigated as "stuffed shirts and trained monkeys!" Mrs. Eddy eventually gave them up to their own devices, although she absolutely refused to remove the estoppel clauses from the Church Manual which, if adhered to, would have severely limited their sphere of influence after she passed on. Her battle with them, well documented through many letters referenced in Carpen-

ter's "Mary Baker Eddy, Her Spiritual Precepts," was over their lack of urgency in doing the will of God, and instead, operating from the standpoint of human expediency. This was best expressed by the then-clerk of the mother church, John Dittemore, after her passing: "This church is run as a plain business proposition, and its future will be in accordance with plain business principles." Nothing could have been more antagonistic to Mrs. Eddy's vision and the true practice of Christian Science!

Mrs. Stetson, on the other hand, governed her church from the standpoint of demonstration, striving to do God's will as she understood it. This outraged the carnal mind which always demands "due process," but proved to be highly productive in the healing work. She built offices for practitioners in her church, and kept careful watch over their work as to their proper practice of Christian Science. Even though Mrs. Stetson's dynamic approach may have tested the letter of the Church Manual, apparently Mrs. Eddy felt she was far more obedient to the spirit than were the board of directors! The fierceness with which the board pursued and excommunicated Mrs. Stetson and those faithful to her indicated they felt she posed a dire threat to their authority. And there were plenty of people in Mrs. Stetson's church who also took exception to her mode of operation, out of envy and jealousy.

With the excommunication of Mrs. Stetson, Mrs. Eddy turned away from the board of directors to the spiritual organization, and urged Mrs. Stetson to do the same. Never did she withdraw her love and support and high expectation from her precious student.

The Bible warns of "the war of the flesh against the spirit." Christ Jesus said, "Blessed are they that are persecuted for my sake" So in the history under considera-

tion, who was on the right side? Did Mrs. Stetson represent the flesh, this brash woman who had no problem telling people what to do, who, it is claimed, brazenly patronized our Leader, and then defied authority in operating her church? Yes, she may have had a great record in the healing and teaching department, but was she so materialistic it must have been hypnotism at work?

Was Mary Baker Eddy, the Discoverer and Founder of Christian Science, the one so far in advance of the age and all of her students and followers, was she so bewitched by Mrs. Stetson that she could not see what the rest saw? — Or is the human concept of the spiritual idea so skewed with self-pride, so pathetically inadequate, that it sees "a friend of Beelzebub" when confronted with the Christ-spirit?

We write this from the standpoint of our first-hand experience with Doris White Evans, who, like Mrs. Stetson, had a tremendous healing record, who was excommunicated by the board of directors, and had many detractors. The one thing Mrs. Evans had which Mrs. Stetson did not have was a church that stood with her in defiance of the b.o.d., and which stands today, the Plainfield Christian Science Church, Independent, a spiritual organization.



Recorded Healings by Mary Baker Eddy

The following is from a collection of healings achieved by Mrs. Eddy, included in the booklet, "The Overwhelming Evidence Concerning Spiritual Healings Through Mary Baker Eddy,: compiled by Ralph Spencer. This booklet is available from Plainfield Church.

At the birth of my youngest child, now eight years old, I thought my approaching confinement would be premature by several weeks, and sent Mrs. Eddy a message to that effect. Without seeing me, she returned an answer that the proper time had come, and that she would be with me immediately.

Slight labor pains had commenced before she arrived. She stopped them at once, and requested me to call an obstetrician, but to keep him below stairs until after the birth. When the doctor arrived, and while he remained in a lower room, Mrs. Eddy came to my bedside. I asked her how I should lie. She answered, "It makes no difference how you lie," and added, "Now let the child be born." Immediately the birth took place, and without pain. The doctor was then called into the room to receive the child, and he saw that I had no pain whatever.

I confess my own astonishment. I did not expect so much, even from Mrs. Eddy, especially as I had suffered before very severely in childbirth. The physician covered me with extra bed-clothes, charged me to be very careful about taking cold and to keep quiet, and then went away. I think he was alarmed at my having no labor-pains, but before he went out I had a chill coming on. When the door closed behind him, Mrs. Eddy threw off the extra coverings and said, "It is nothing but the fear produced by the doctor

that causes these chills." They left me at once. She told me to sit up when I chose, and eat whatever I wanted. I sat up for several hours and ate whatever the family did, and never experienced the least inconvenience from this course. In one week I was about the house and was well, running up and down stairs and attending to domestic duties.

For several years I had been troubled with prolapsus uteri, which disappeared entirely after Mrs. Eddy's wonderful demonstration of Christian Science at the birth of my babe.

Only a Belief

"When one is sick, why do you say, 'It is only a belief'?" This often-asked question has an answer in the following incident, told by a New York Scientist.

While playing lawn-tennis, a young woman was hit in the face by a tennis ball. After recovering from her confusion, she found that her two front teeth, supplied to her by the dentist and set in gold, were gone. She quickly arrived at the conclusion that she had swallowed her teeth, and that her life was in danger.

Had she been a Christian Scientist, she would have known that the swallowing of her teeth was only a belief, and that, as God's child, she was "all right." Not being a Christian Scientist, she sent for the family physician, who knew she had swallowed her teeth, and that she was "all wrong." The usual grave announcement was made: "The case is very critical," followed by the frank avowal that "The teeth, with their gold prongs, cannot be pumped up or thrown up. The patient must be kept very quiet. She will grow weak, lose her appetite, take to her bed, suffer severe pain, have convulsions, and most likely die."

It is not said that the physician was a prophet nor the son of a prophet. Oh the time-honored (?) custom that decrees the fulfillment of medical prophecy. In a critical (?)

case, to prophesy doleful disaster is very "regular," to declare that it is only a belief is very "irregular."

In this case the treatment was "regular," and the symptoms which followed were "regular." The patient was kept quiet; she grew weak; she lost her appetite; she took to her bed; she suffered severe pain — but she did not have the convulsions. Before this symptom was due to manifest itself, the patient's sister found the teeth in the grass on the lawn and carried them to the patient, who was thereby convinced that the swallowing of her teeth was only a "belief." When she saw that the teeth in her stomach were only a *belief*, and not a *reality*, she saw there was no necessity for convulsions, in fact no necessity for her being in bed at all, or for that matter, being in any way ill. Then she knew she was all right, and she *was* all right.

Had Christian Science cared for the case, what was known last would have been known first, and several unnecessary illusions would have been avoided; for she would then have known that the swallowing of her teeth was *only a belief*, and that, as God's child, she was all right.

Moral.—Learn to *know* that your "beliefs" are in the grass and not in yourself, and *you* will be all right.

Of all the virtues, can there be found one more prolific of quiet, peaceful happiness, more overflowing with love and kindness, than gratitude? This subject has been frequently in my thought.

When on vacation, one Sunday evening it was my privilege to hear a learned bishop of the Episcopal Church deliver a sermon. In his address he stated that in his old parish, in one of the large eastern cities, a parish that contained some of the best Christian workers he had ever known, on the reading desks in the church were the old prayer-books that had been there for over a century. They were not then being used, more modern ones having replaced them.

One day the thought came to him to look over these old books, and see what prayers to God had been most fre-

It is not our work to create anything, to make anything, or to produce anything. God has already done that. Our work is to stop believing a lie, and to stop accepting the suggestions of error.

Mary Baker Eddy has written, "Your true course is to destroy the foe, and leave the field to God, Life, Truth, and Love, remembering that God and His ideas alone are real and harmonious." (S&H)

God's work is done; and His creation exists, and must continue to exist, complete, harmonious, and perfect. Our work is to eliminate the fog of false belief that claims to

hide the true idea. We do not have to make evil unreal; evil is unreal, and our part is to know that it is unreal. Neither do we ever have to make good real; it already is so. We do not declare the truth to make it true; we declare it because it *is* true.

Letting go of error allows the true idea to shine through. If a rubber ball is squeezed tightly, the ball loses its natural shape and becomes distorted, and will remain so as long as the cramping grip is maintained. In order to restore it to its normal condition, nothing needs to be done

but to let go — to release the hold. Then at once the abnormality and distortion vanishes.

Mary Baker Eddy says in Unity of Good, "By knowing the unreality of disease, sin, and death, you demonstrate the allness of God." This "knowing," then, comprises the

whole of our work. But this does not mean that our work is merely passive. The destruction of error calls for the use of the two-edged sword; for how can we see the unreality of any evil, except we first see, and hold to, the truth which proves its falsity? Honest, earnest seeking of the light is true prayer; and no true prayer goes unanswered!

Having thoroughly done our work of destroying the foe, casting out the evil belief, we can rejoice and confidently "leave the field to God."

Watch when the telephone rings, or when you receive letters, messages, etc., or when the doorbell rings — handle mesmerism, and know that you are not getting anything but from God. Then it is handled before it even reaches you.

Power of a Right Decision

"Agree with thine adversary quickly, whiles thou art in the way with him; lest at any time the adversary deliver thee to the judge, and the judge deliver thee to the officer, and thou be cast into prison." These words of Jesus bring forth

the great fact that the only thing we ever have to do — the only thing we can do — is to decide to be obedient to divine Principle. When we have done that, our problem is well on the way to being solved.

Sometimes mortal thought tries to deceive us into believing that we must change our environment, our business, even our entire future, in order to find health, happiness, and success. But, in reality, salvation lies in deciding to stand with divine Principle, Truth. As Paul put it to the Ephesians, "Wherefore take unto you the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand."

Early in my study of Christian Science, I began to find new hope and a new life, after a long, hard battle with some

medical problems. Yet, back in consciousness, there lurked the reservation to retain a doctor's prescription that had seemed necessary to overcome suffering and ward off death. The practitioner soon discovered this "enemy," and said, "When you can say with Job, 'Though he slay me, yet will I

trust in him,' you will be healed." I felt I was in the "valley of decision," with the truth on one side, and medical remedies on the other. One thought kept coming to me, "Choose you this day whom ye will serve." The material evidence soon lost its importance, and I could honestly say, "Even if error seems to slay me, yet will I trust God, good."

Then came hours of testing. Error tried to weaken this new God-given trust; but faith, stronger than the temptation, conquered; and I suddenly found myself free. Semi-invalidism of 14 years, a seemingly unbearable sorrow, and diseases pronounced incurable fell away like an old cloak,

leaving me strong, enduring, and as well as I had ever been. Nothing was left to tell of the seeming struggle, except the memory of the power of a right decision.

Mrs. Eddy says, "Your decisions will master you, whichever direction they take." (S&H) To get nearer to the heart of divine Love is mankind's great need; and Truth is ever whispering to the heartsick and burdened, "Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heaven laden, and I will give you rest."



Vigilance Always Necessary

Recently I had the joy of sleeping at my brother's sheep farm in a remote place, far from the maddening crowd! I fell off to sleep in such peace, but an hour into the night, I was awakened by barking dogs, the dogs whose sole purpose is to guard the sheep from predators. They barked all night, it seemed, and I did not have a restful night because I was imagining there might be trouble out there. In the morning, in relating the experience to my brother, he laughed and said that, when the dogs are barking, that is when he sleeps soundly. It is when the night is silent he worries!

It turns out, the wolves are always on the prowl, waiting for an opportunity to move in for the kill. The guard dogs let the wolves know that there will be hell to pay if they trespass!

These kinds of things always carry a lesson to the student of Christian Science, otherwise they would not have entered experience. This is what I came up with: The sheep

represent the spiritual thought, the wolves, material sense. Once the student claims his rightful heritage as spiritual, made in the image of God, material sense is on the prowl to contradict and destroy. The barking dogs could represent our difficult experiences, those that stir us out of complacency, when we are reminded we must shut the door on material sense and "Rise in the strength of Spirit to resist all that is unlike good." (S&H)

Mrs. Eddy distributed the following Watch in her home at Pleasant View: "The unseen silent forces of God are standing sentinel over me and mine and all, silencing, destroying, annihilating the unseen silent arguments of the serpent, material sense." (Watches, Prayers, and Arguments) Apparently barking dogs were not necessary to protect her home, but this Watch indicates, nonetheless, that the threat was there and that the work had to be done to keep the serpent (or wolves) out. Notice the unction with which the silent arguments of the serpent are handled: silenced, destroyed, annihilated. No pussy-footing around!

We must guard the door of our thought against the entrance of opposing beliefs of selfishness, envy, resentment, laziness. This is an important point, if we want to enjoy the fulfillment of Jesus' promise of salvation and supply. This process of correction is necessary, and results in better health.

Response:

Excellent. I too got something fresh: the Father welcomed the prodigal back with a celebration because "he was dead and now is alive."

In the material, self-absorbed, self-loving, self-loathing state, I am dead. Turning to the heavenly Father/Principle-Mother/Love, I am made alive. Makes

sense, especially because God IS Life! There is no other life.

What a revolution in medical care if this was the new criterion for health and life!!

Response:

Human thoughts lead to death — so he was obviously suffering in this state of thought. So divine Love was operating right in that spot, and he was receptive. How often do we see suffering people refuse to turn to God. They blame everyone else for their problems. Refusing to expose sin hastens death. But not the prodigal son — he turned to God and repented! He wanted what he had lost, so he fought for it.

Response:

Wonderful parable with more than one theme. I also notice that the Scripture tells that the Father waited and watched. He looked for his son daily. He never gave up hope that his son would return. I believe that he was holding "thought steadfastly to the enduring, the good, and the true." It was this pure love which externalized, and brought his son home.

Just like our Father, Mother, God, the father in this story waits on his son (as God waits on us) to turn from sense to Soul. He (Divine Love), is always right there, ready to receive us with open arms, and never with condemnation!

The Great White Throne

In his letters to Timothy, the Apostle Paul exhorted the followers of Christ to pray for "all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty."

Mary Baker Eddy also exhorted her church (Christian Science versus Pantheism, p. 14): "Pray for the prosperity of our country, and for her victory under arms; that justice, mercy, and peace continue to characterize her government, and that they shall rule all nations. Pray that the divine presence may still guide and bless our chief magistrate, those associated with his executive trust, and our national judiciary; give to our congress wisdom, and uphold

our nation with the right arm of His righteousness." In this same message, Mrs. Eddy included a prayer and blessing for the brave men in our country's armed forces.

Obedient Christian Scientists have prayed thus for many years, and have learned that righteous prayer not only achieves victory and blessings, but purifies the thought of the one who prays, freeing it from destructive criticism and resentful thinking. It also opens one's eyes to opportunities for service that otherwise might not have been seen.

The following incident, which occurred some years ago, will serve to illustrate this point. The then-President of the United States had accepted an invitation to deliver the address at the unveiling of a monument on one of the battlefields of the American Revolution. A few days before the event, a federal agent discovered a plot to assassinate the President as soon as he should rise on the platform to address those present. The agent hastened back to Washington with his report, but he stopped off between trains to seek out two Christian Science practitioners, who resided in that state. He asked these practitioners to pray for the President's safety, which they most gladly agreed to do. For some years they had daily prayed as our Leader had requested in her message, but this was a call for special prayer.

The proper authorities took the human steps necessary to ensure against trouble, and all went well.

During the four hours that the President was in their state, the two practitioners devoted the entire time to prayer. While they were praying, a strange thing happened: they both became almost overwhelmed by a sense of crushing burden, so heavy and cruel that it seemed as if no human being could endure it.

"The World Has Need of You"

Said the one to the other, "Can it be that this is the load our Presidents have to bear?" Then they both prayed to lift that load. These words from Isaiah came to them: "Is not this the fast that I have chosen? to loose the bands of wickedness, to undo the heavy burdens, and to let the oppressed go free, and that ye break every yoke?"

A new light dawned for them upon the vision of St. John, where the Revelator tells of "a great white throne" in heaven, and of the One who sat upon it. These two practitioners saw and understood, as never before, the absolute supremacy of God's government and the oneness and allness of the divine Mind. They saw clearly that there are not thrones many — just one; also, that there are not rulers many — only One. In the same reality of being there are not minds many, hating and being hated, hypnotizing and being hypnotized, because the one divine Mind includes and governs all. They awakened to the idolatry of seeing persons in the place of divine Principle. All authority is in God. To think otherwise is to think destructively instead of constructively concerning our government.

As these two practitioners prayed, the sense of burden began to lift until nothing was left to it; and in place thereof was a great consciousness of freedom, of absolute safety, peace, and harmony.

Two days later they found in the morning newspaper the account of an interview given by the President's secretary. The secretary told of how the President had enjoyed his time away, and had returned in excellent health and spirits, and he closed with these words: "The President says that while on this trip he felt the lifting of a crushing mental load which descended upon him when he took the oath of office, and from which he had experienced no relief until now." It is not difficult to imagine the overflowing gratitude

to God, and the humility and joy, with which those Christian Scientists read of that interview; nor is it difficult to understand that this was a lesson never to be forgotten.

Every true Christian knows that there is a forever "firmament," or firm, uncompromising line of separation, between good and evil. Right is right, and wrong is wrong. Moral values must be kept straight and clear until all belief in a power apart from God, good, is wiped out by divine Science. But we must observe the Christ-rule in the destruction of evil. This rule scientifically impersonalizes evil, and then destroys it. This action of the Christ-consciousness heals and saves. Cruel and destructive action is not Science, is not the Christ-way, and does not proceed from God.

The Christ Science that uncovers error as impersonal and unreal destroys it. If we personalize error, we give it, in belief, an agent with which to strike back. The whole world has now learned a lesson in the awful error of appeasement. We have tasted and now know the deadly nature of the mental narcotic of apathy, and we want no more of it; but our testing times are not yet over, and we cannot afford to lessen our watch and prayers. The sword of the righteous can halt the sword of aggression, but it cannot destroy the wicked motives back of aggressive warfare — only the Christ, Truth, can do that.

The Search for Wisdom

Many people spend a lifetime seeking knowledge and desiring wisdom. The Bible is full of guidance as to where wisdom comes from. In Proverbs, we read, "The Lord giveth wisdom: out of His mouth cometh knowledge and understanding." Mary Baker Eddy explains that God is Mind, and the only Mind, the source of all knowledge and wisdom, and that we don't need to look any farther for it. And how far is God? In Job we read, "He that is perfect in knowledge is with thee." Here we have Biblical authority for the fact that God, and all His wisdom and knowledge, is right here with us!

So, what's the problem? How do I make good decisions? Once again, we need look no further than Proverbs: "He layeth up sound wisdom for the righteous: He is a buckler for them that walk uprightly." If you want wisdom, the Bible tells us to live a righteous life. Walk uprightly. Obey God and His precepts. Support those who are living a selfless, Christly life. This opens the door to intelligence and wisdom. All the human education in the world can't compare to living a Christly life.

Jesus always knew what he needed to know, for the purpose of healing sickness and sin, and teaching others how to do the same. God revealed to him the truth about every situation. And why was he able to hear God's voice? Because he was living the most righteous life the world had ever seen and was giving mankind the most valuable message it had ever heard. He told the Samaritan woman things about her life that only she knew. He read his disciples' thoughts.

Articles

Some of the most successful businessmen and statesmen have acknowledged having a strong faith in God. Many admit to praying and to relying on "instinct" or "common sense" before making tough decisions in which there is no humanly possible way to know the right answer.

How many people spend countless years in school accumulating human, material knowledge, thinking that, somehow, that would make them more intelligent? Mrs. Eddy addresses this misconception in our textbook, Science and Health, on page 196: "If materialistic knowledge is power, it is not wisdom. It is but a blind force. Man has 'sought out many inventions,' but he has not yet found that knowledge can save him from the dire effects of knowledge." True knowledge, however, is the knowledge to know what the human need is at the time, and to know how to meet it. This is the only legitimate basis for all human activity. This knowledge comes only from God, and requires that we have our strong connection with Him in order to hear it. It is the moral requirement, and is true wisdom.

Living a life of obedience to God is a rebuke to those who prefer to glorify their human knowledge, are too selfish to put mankind's needs above their own wants, or are too proud to submit to the will of God. They may be smart about the ways of the world, but they will never gain the true wisdom that comes only from God.

This wisdom can only bless mankind. It can never harm. It is always at hand. Since it is always right, and always a blessing, could there be any reason to turn to anything or anyone else than to God for the answer to all our problems? Once again, in Proverbs, "In all thy ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct thy paths." There is no other source for knowledge and wisdom than "He who maketh all things."
