One thing is eternally here; it reigns supreme to-day, to-morrow, forever. We need it in our homes, at our firesides, on our altars, for with it win we the race of the centuries. We have it only as we live it. This is that needful one thing — divine Science, whereby thought is *spiritualized*, reaching outward and upward to Science in Christianity, Science in medicine, in physics, and in metaphysics.

I reluctantly foresee great danger threatening our nation, — imperialism, monopoly, and a lax system of religion. But the spirit of humanity, ethics, and Christianity sown broadcast — all concomitants of Christian Science — is taking strong hold of the public thought throughout our beloved country and in foreign lands, and is tending to counteract the trend of mad ambition.

O ye who leap disdainfully from this rock of ages, return and plant thy steps in Christ, Truth, "the stone which the builders rejected"! Then will angels administer grace, do thy errands, and be thy dearest allies. The divine law gives to man health and life everlasting — gives a soul to Soul, a present harmony wherein the good man's heart takes hold on heaven, and whose feet can never be moved. These are His green pastures beside still waters, where faith mounts upward, expatiates, strengthens, and exults.

Beloved, that which purifies the affections also strengthens them, removes fear, subdues sin, and endues with divine power; that which refines character at the same time humbles, exalts, and commands a man, and obedience gives him courage, devotion, and attainment. The Church of the Future

The world will see a marvelous change when the Church confesses that she has a mission, not only to the individual, but in behalf of the individual.

Regarding, for instance, the great principles of health, where are we going to discover a cure-all for the world's disease? Some of it in our laboratories, possibly. I believe in laboratories, but I believe in something more. We are sick because we are incomplete, because we have not learned to control the things that are beneath us. I beg you not to sneer at people who believe that there is a spiritual remedy for the physical ills of man. There is such a remedy. How can a Christian minister denounce from his pulpit the people who believe that there is a spiritual remedy for physical ailments, when he believes the stories of the healings wrought by Jesus of Nazareth?

I believe it should be the part of religion not only to discover the secret of health, but also to discover the secret of material prosperity, and to banish poverty from the world. I believe the church ought to be a leader in everything. I can see reasons why she has lagged behind in the social procession. It has been because she had a theoretical basis instead of a practical basis.

Reported in Washington News Letter

Hon. Nat Ward Fitz-Gerald, of Salt Lake City, gave a history of his wonderful healing by Christian Science at the last Wednesday evening meeting in this city. Col. Fitz-Gerald was educated for the ministry, and preached about two years and became impressed with the belief that orthodox religion was "sounding brass, or a tinkling cymbal." He was of the opinion that the Church which could not heal the sick was a fraud, and he became disgusted and left the ministry.

In this belief he remained for some twenty years, when he became very much afflicted and went to southern California to regain his health. There he employed the best physician he could obtain, who, in consultation with others, decided that the Colonel, before he could recover, must have a surgical operation. In order to "build him up," a private house was obtained where he might be cared for and nursed after going through the operation. This family happened to be Christian Scientists, and there being but few other members of that society in the little town, the meetings were held in their house. The Colonel had his doors padded so as to prevent his hearing anything from this, to him, hated sect.

The doctors performed their operation, and gave out the report that it would take at least three months for him to be able to get around, but gave as their opinion that he never would recover. The day the operation was performed, the Colonel lay in a stupor until nearly two o'clock in the afternoon; and when he became conscious, he heard the Christian Scientists holding their meeting in the next room, the padding of the doors not being sufficient to prevent. He said that from the first word he heard, his atten-

tion became riveted and interested in the subject, and the more he heard, the more he wished to hear, until finally throughout his system he felt a radical change, and that God was healing him. Suffice it to say that the Colonel, that afternoon, was perfectly cured, and the next morning got up, dressed himself, and visited the doctors at their office. When they saw him they were certain it was his disembodied spirit that had appeared to them.

To use the beautiful expression of the Colonel, he said in closing that his condition was like those "who came to scoff, but remained to pray."

Spiritual Law versus Material Law

Sometimes Christian Scientists think it's necessary to know all about the so-called material laws believed to govern disease, in order to destroy them. But what is most important is to clearly understand that God's law is the only real law, and that this law annihilates everything unlike itself.

Matter is merely the outcome of a belief in a mind apart from God, and has no intelligence, no substance, no place, presence, or power. Mary Baker Eddy says, "The basic error is mortal mind." (S&H) Then why would it be

necessary to know every phase or claim of these false laws in order to destroy them?

If a case is not healed quickly, is it because of a lack of knowledge of the material laws regarding the problem — or is it because one does not know enough about God's law? Mrs. Eddy's answer is, "If you fail to succeed in any case, it is because you have not demonstrated the life of Christ, Truth, more in your own life, — because you have not obeyed the rule and proved the Principle of divine Science." (S&H)

Is it a lack of knowledge of material laws, or not enough knowledge about God's law? There is nothing more discouraging than thinking that, because we do not know about some specific material law, we are powerless to lift someone out of suffering. Jesus did not say that we had to know anything about the so-called laws of matter; but he did say, "Ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free."

Truth uncovers error; and as practitioners of Christian Science,

whatever we need to know will be uncovered, if we are faithful in our work. This does not mean that we don't have to deny material law. Christian Science teaches that in order to heal any belief of sin or sickness, we have to deny and destroy every belief of material law that presents itself to our mentality. But if we are spending our time searching out material laws and their *modus operandi*, we are simply accumulating more error in our thought, making the error more real, and it may require a great deal of work to eradicate it.

It is the understanding of spiritual law, it is the putting on of the Mind of Christ, it is the honest endeavor to see man as God sees him, for which we should be striving!

Not by seeking out more of the ways and means of error, not by "diving into the shallows of mortal belief" (S&H), but by cleaning our own mentality of all that is unlike God, do we bring in the Christlike qualities of thought, which alone are healing and redeeming mankind.



How's Your Attic?

Through Christ, or Truth, we can face, eliminate, and replace cluttering beliefs — erroneous, negative, limiting concepts that restrict our progress — with the right idea of God and man.

"Feed My Sheep"

A good housekeeper does not ignore dirt. She does not allow it to accumulate, but disposes of it to keep her house immaculate. Correspondingly, a willing, alert, and openminded person does not overlook error and allow it to build up. Nor does one who is honest justify a mistake or a wrong stand he has taken. Self-justification does not get rid of error, but allows it to pile up.

Christian Science teaches to hold firmly to the truth of being. Each child of God reflects dominion over his own consciousness. Therefore, we can think what is right, and firmly reject the wrong. We have power from God to hold only good in thought! Mary Baker Eddy says, "Know, then, that you possess sovereign power to think and act rightly, and that nothing can dispossess you of this heritage and trespass on Love." (S&H)

We can never be mesmerized to cling to error, and it can't cling to us. We have power from God to accept and retain good alone.

How heartening that false beliefs can be put completely out of thought! Because only good has ever touched man's consciousness, there is nothing for us to retain in thought but good. And the retention in thought of good is certain to permit only harmony in our bodies and our affairs.

Watching Point No. 96 Gilbert C. Carpenter

WATCH lest, in your denial of false testimony, you build it up instead of tearing it down. If you deny the evidence of the material senses and the seeming reality of discord, merely because you are inharmonious in the flesh, and desire to regain that lost physical harmony, with little or no thought of spiritual growth or unselfish giving, do not be surprised if your denials tend to accentuate the reality of the error assailing you, rather than to diminish it.

When mortal man is seeking nothing higher than material harmony, he denies the error of effect as if it were cause, rather than for the purpose of tracing it back to cause. Error is never something; it is a belief in falsity that does not really exist.

One can say that it is not as serious to have the devil in you, as it is to have God out of you. Hence a higher motive in striving to eliminate error would be to eliminate anything that could claim to shut out the sunshine of God's love. Before one affirms the allness of God, he should know that nothing can darken man's thought, or cause him to believe that he is or ever can be shut off from the primitive good that is his birthright.

The dragging anchor of a ship would have to be pulled up before the ship could progress. It is the testimony of matter and its supposed conditions that constitutes the

anchor that so holds thought, that it cannot progress into the realm where all problems are solvable. Therefore, the denial of the evidence before the material senses, and the declaration that matter is nothing, are needed in order to convince thought that matter is nothing because it is *nothing* to consider, *nothing* to fear, *nothing* to work with, *nothing* to try to correct. This enables thought to let go its anchor, to retreat from the body, or effect, in order to work in and with cause.

The Decoy

Several years ago Coca Cola introduced what it called "new Coke." Everything about new Coke was identical with the original — except the flavor. What would happen if a first-time consumer drank new Coke? They never would know what they were missing! But the consumers of original Coke spotted the difference instantly and demanded the original.

And so it is at Plainfield. Plainfield never accepts or tolerates the Christian Science decoy that is taught in the Boston movement, referred to as "the Boston culture."

This explains why Plainfield strikes a clear distinction between Christian Science practiced in Plainfield and the Boston culture. There is a difference. Plainfield members consistently distinguish this difference in testimonies, arti-

cles, and Roundtable discussions. There is a decoy out there masquerading as Christian Science, but Plainfield is the "original Coke." I speak from experience — I have tasted both!

I was born into Christian Science. In my 20's I went through class instruction with a world-renowned teacher and practitioner, and faithfully attended 15 association addresses. I learned that God was all powerful and man is perfect. He used many arguments to show the impossibility of error. It sounded great, and his association was the largest in the world, so it must be true.

We all got a "lift" each year at association. But the sin in me remained covered. Never once was I taught to examine myself for sin, expose it, repent with all my heart, and strive to do God's will. My teaching was incomplete and powerless — there was no spirit. I had been taught through Christian Science arguments that God is all powerful and therefore error, sin, sickness, etc., were unreal and powerless. But I wasn't taught how to feel connected to God. Plainfield teaches students to cultivate the spiritual sense within us all and *feel* God's presence guiding us. And sin must be exposed and cast out. Hidden sin is deadly.

When the medical community pronounced that my 7-year-old son had an incurable virus, I turned to my Boston teacher for help, and discovered over a period of time that our prayers and arguments were powerless. I felt nothing; I had a callous heart. The core of my life was impure and I was a hypocrite! Why? I declared God is good and there can be no disease, yet my thought was diseased with sin. Devoid of the moral requirements of spiritual living demanded by Christian Science, I had faith without works. Deep down I knew I was responsible for my sin, but felt unprepared and ill-equipped to set it aside during the trial of my life. My teaching and teacher couldn't save my

son. Nor could the doctors.

I turned to Science and Health looking for answers after my son passed. I didn't blame God or Christian Science or the medical community. Instead I was lead to this statement on page 149 of Science and Health: "The rule and its perfection of operation never vary in Science. If you fail to succeed in any case, it is because you have not demonstrated the life of Christ, Truth, more in your own life, because you have not obeyed the rule and proved the Principle of divine Science." Here was my answer. I wept.

I was referred to Plainfield Church 18 months ago, and as a new listener I was often shocked and offended by these pointed remarks about the Boston culture — because I was entangled with those ideas. Plainfield draws sharp and uncompromising comparisons between real, independent Christian Science and what is being taught in the Boston movement. I had not grown enough in Truth to discern their correctness. I hadn't experienced the original transforming power of Christian Science.

Working with a practitioner in Plainfield who patiently and lovingly pointed out my mindless habits of thought and talk, I have come to understand a little of Christian Science, the love required, the honesty — and my callousness has largely disappeared. Now I recognize the decoy, loathe it, and am able to reach out and really bless my fellow man, feel the need and meet it. No more hollow "treatments" or "arguments." Truly, "It is the spirit that quickeneth; the flesh profiteth nothing."

If you are new to Plainfield, have an open heart, and truly want to learn how to practice the divine Science of God, I promise you the light of truth will dawn in your thought. But I had to learn to get on my knees and admit I knew nothing at all about Christian Science. Sometimes we are brought low so we can rise.

The one was to call disease animal magnetism as the specific term for error or mortal mind, and then handle animal magnetism. And the other was that Christian Scientists are not healing because they do not know how to handle animal magnetism.

"Here is a challenge to you. Do you not know how to handle animal magnetism? If not, why not; and from this moment let your every intent be to know how to handle animal magnetism and then do it; and heal the sick intelligently and instantaneously, which is the only way Christian Science does."

The book is bound in flexible red leatherette and contains 1040 pages. The price is \$27.00.

Self-government

T wo distinct concepts of government exist among nations — the autocratic, which magnifies the State and minimizes individual man, and the democratic, which places individual man in the forefront, with certain natural rights. As stated by Abraham Lincoln, democracy is a "government of the people, by the people, for the people."

The political point of view largely coincides with religious development. As the people of any nation have become more democratic in their thought, they have become freer both in politics and in religion.

Mary Baker Eddy lays special stress upon the right of self-government, and in her definition of it carries thought back to the source of all power and authority, namely, to God. She states, "God has endowed man with inalienable rights, among which are self-government, reason, and conscience. Man is properly self-governed only when he is guided rightly and governed by his Maker, divine Truth and Love." (S&H) Again, she states, "Reflecting God's government, man is self-governed." (S&H)

In a revealing and chilling address given in 1935 by the Soviet head of security, Lavrenty Beria, to American communists, he urged his audience "to produce a maximum of chaos in the culture of the enemy Our fruits are grown in chaos, distrust, economic depression, and scientific turmoil. At last a weary populace can seek peace only in our offered Communist State, at last only communism can resolve the problems of the masses." "To achieve these goals . . . crush every 'home-grown' variety of mental healing in America." Christian Science (among others listed) "must be discredited, defamed, arrested, stamped upon"

Why would Christian Science pose such a threat to a tyrannical system? Because it declares "The relations of God and man, divine Principle and idea, are indestructible in Science." (S&H) Any human system that wishes to assert itself seeks to undermine the individual's relationship with God, because it desires to replace God! This was evident in the Dark Ages when the Church forbade the reading of the Bible. It is evident today in the medical community (AMA), in politics, and yes, even in the Christian Science Boston organization!

So what are we to do about it? The answer is clearly laid out in the Bible and our textbook, Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures. "Heredity is not a law."

Who is to say how someone will turn out and what their destiny is? The human plan is so inferior and is pursued only by those who are selfishly involved with their own pride, and no one needs to be stuck with it. God has a far superior destiny for each and every one, the upward way is equally available to all who are willing to walk in it.

Response:

Think about the blind man Jesus healed. Even his disciples looked for a "hereditary" reason for his blindness! But Jesus blew that away. He refused to go there. This blindness was a mistake, and like all mistakes, it was an opportunity to correct the mistake with the Truth (make manifest the works of God).

It is all too common for people to ask, "Why do bad things happen?" Here is a great example of the need to stop looking for a principle that would cause the mistake, but rather to "wrest" the case from human belief and put it

under the law of God, or Science, "which corrects error with truth and demands spiritual thoughts, divine concepts, to the end that they may produce harmonious results." (S&H)

Mistakes have no principle. That is why they can be healed. As we do this, we naturally attract people to the truth, which is already in their hearts. It only needs to be unfolded.

Response:

To say that heredity is not a law would seem to be outrageous, given all the empirical and genetic evidence, etc., *unless* we deny the material senses, the basis upon which all human thinking rests. This is radical, and if we make no effort to change the basis upon which we operate day-to-day, we had better be careful spouting "heredity is not a law."

Do we check the weather channel or our wallet to see what we can do today? Do we love based upon whether or not we are loved? Do we judge people based on what they have achieved, or how they look, etc.? Do we even bother checking what spiritual sense is telling us? Outside of our "prayerful study" and church-going, where is God in our moment-by-moment decisions?

"For this child I prayed."

Our society puts so much emphasis on all the things that should be done for children — top-notch school systems, sports activities, travel, games galore, health routines, etc. What emphasis is put on prayer? How often do we pray for our children, or is it too much to squeeze into such busy schedules?!

Response:

"And Samuel grew, and the Lord was with him, and did let none of His words fall to the ground." Hannah did two very important things for her unborn child — she prayed for him, and she vowed to give him to the Lord — "as long as he liveth he shall be lent to the Lord." What wonderful results! What could be more important to any child than to feel God's presence and to have God's words inscribed in his (or her) heart?! Is this how we pray for our children, grandchildren, nieces, nephews or for any child God has put into our life? Do we pray *at all*, or once in a blue moon? Have we given them over to God who is their Creator?

Response:

Before finding Christian Science, I tried Silva Mind Control, a system that promises healing power. It seemed amazingly effective in reversing physical and mental problems, but the clincher for me was when the instructor explained how it can be used in "guiding" your children through mental means. There was no God in it! Who was to say you would not misguide your children, "meaning well."

This sent shivers up my spine, and prepared me for Christian Science. The key impediment in raising children is the desire to possess them, guide them as *you* would have them be guided. Perhaps that was Eli and his wife's problem. Their children did just what was expected of them, served in the temple, and turned out very badly!!

Hannah relinquished all sense of possession to God. Hence her prayer was righteous and enabled a great prophet and leader to emerge.

Soon after coming to Plainfield Church, whenever I would go through a learning time or a purifying experience, at first I would often be tempted to ruminate over the experience, and either feel angry at myself, resentful at the correction, or embarrassed by what I had done. But a practitioner helped me to see that all this is personal sense, the human mind in full bloom! What I really needed to do was to drop the past, be grateful for the growth and the progress, and rejoice that my thought had been transformed by the experience.

I learned that if we continue to mull over the past and keep reliving what may have felt like an unpleasant experience at the time, we're keeping those fires in the "furnace of affliction" alive, and causing ourselves needless suffering — and making something real that was never real to begin with! Whatever has been refined out, was never the truth about God's perfect creation — so why dwell on it, build it up, and make it into a mountain? Once those "fires of affliction" have done their work, let them go, and move forward.

The Bible says, "God requireth that which is past." We need to give our trying times over to God, so He can dispose of them. Then we can look ahead to a bright future, full of promise. We can be grateful to God for what He has done in our lives, how he has purified us and helped us to see ourselves more clearly as His image. Then we can move forward and be of use to God in this mighty, and greatly rewarding work.

Failure, Humility, and Progress Gary Singleterry

If we are doing our very best and seem to run into a problem, or fail at something, that is not the time to despair or give up. It is an opportunity to learn a good lesson, and to be better, so that we can be of better use to God. However, this process of learning and growing requires one very important quality — humility. ("And what doth the Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?" (Mic.)) Humility is perhaps one of the most under-rated and under-appreciated qualities today.

Early in my business career, I was privileged to work with a wise Christian man who was one of the best investors in his field. One day he explained to me that when he evaluates people and their business plans, he never invests money with anyone who has never failed at least once at starting a new business. If they have never failed before, he will not invest with them. His reasoning was simple and wise. People develop humility by failing, and humility is essential for them to handle the challenges of any new venture. He did not want his investment with them to be their first business failure. He wanted them to already have that humility that would enhance the likelihood of their success. It was a simple test and a simple rule, and it served him very well.

In Christian Science, we learn that progress is God's law. Progress is not always smooth. It can come in fits and starts, and often has a bumpy path. Humility is the mental quality that gets us over the bumps. It is our sure connection with God that provides the guidance and the courage to keep going. Without it, one cannot make progress.

About ten years later, I found myself starting a new

business. I didn't know everything I would have liked to know about the business, but I sought God's guidance, at least most of the time. For a while, everything seemed to be going well, but at a critical time I became prideful, thinking I had accomplished success on my own. The business crashed. It failed miserably. I faced the grim decision to either pick up the pieces and keep going, or chuck it all and find another job or something else to do. I had a young family to care for, and needed a reliable source of income.

As I prayed to God for guidance, the thought came strongly, "You've learned some really good lessons from this experience. Keep going." So I did. And with new-found humility, and with God's help, the business got going on a more secure footing. And within a short time, all that I had lost was fully restored. And most importantly, I gained some humility that I may not have gained otherwise.

No one would ever seek failure, but we should never fear it, for out of it can grow the greatest blessings — humility being first and foremost.

Bible Study Classes

"I, Mary Baker Eddy, ordain the Bible, and Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures, Pastor over The Mother Church." (Mis.) Here, Mrs. Eddy does not ordain Science and Health as the sole pastor, nor as the primary pastor.

It often seems as if the Bible is relegated to some secondary role. Indeed, if you were to ask a Christian Scientist what else there is to read other than Science and Health, they would probably refer you to other writings by Mary Baker Eddy. However, Mrs. Eddy said that together they are the Pastor. Therefore, it should be just as worthy to read each page in the Bible as it is to read each page of Science and Health.

When I visit a Reading Room, I notice that there are only a few books available for studying the Bible, and the selection is virtually unchanged from many decades ago. I also notice that when the Bible is studied, the focus is so

oriented to the spiritual interpretation that there is little learning of the Bible, and much of the Bible just seems to be ignored.

It was not always that way. Over 50 years ago, Edith Hoyt wrote a book and gave lectures on "Studies in the Apocalypse of St. John." She was a Christian Scientist, and many Christian Scientists studied her book. For her study, she extensively used the Bible and other Bible study books, and she even delved into the meaning of Greek words.

In 1911, the Christian Science Publishing Society published the pamphlet, "Causation, in the Light of Christian Science," by Frederick Dixon. This pamphlet was based on this statement on page 170 of Science and Health: "Spiritual causation is the one question to be considered, for more than all others spiritual causation relates to human progress." In this pamphlet, Frederick Dixon frequently refers to Greek words from the New Testament. He also quotes from the Wycliff Bible.

There seems to have been a time and place when Christian Scientists really studied the Bible. However, that was not my experience, and this was one of the reasons I questioned the Boston Church. When I joined the Plainfield Church, I observed that the Bible was an important part of the church, and this was an important consideration when I became a member of this church.

When a practitioner suggested having a Bible study, I immediately said this was a great idea and I would be glad to help. There was no precedent, so we were feeling our way. I thought it was helpful to start out with some Bible facts. Word definitions were included, as this is critical to understanding the Bible and Christian Science. We should all be using a wide range of sources to help understand the Bible. People should not be constrained in the reference

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material that is used, and they should feel comfortable using different sources. However, the Bible study would not dictate what those sources should be.

The Plainfield Church is a lay church. Therefore, members participate and contribute. The purpose of the Bible Study leader is not to teach, but to lead the discussion. The aim is to create an environment to foster learning, to promote people's interest in the Bible, and to generate eagerness to contribute. Initially, it was discussed that the Bible Studies might only be a few here and there, but in the first year we saw it was held almost every week. Now, each week a different participant prepares questions and leads the discussion. It has become a regular part of the church activities, and we look forward to more enriching and enjoyable Bible Studies.



Don't Be Fooled By Delusion Mary Beth Singleterry

In our textbook, Science and Health, Mrs. Eddy uses the word "delusion" or "delusions" almost twenty times. She classifies as delusion sin, disease, and death; the belief of life in matter; the belief of many minds; and the belief in memory loss. Mrs. Eddy is quite radical, for what she calls delusion, the world considers natural and normal!

Many years ago I found a helpful definition of the word "delusion," and it is this: "a fixed, dominating or persistent false mental concept, resistant to reason with regard to actual things or matters of fact." Working with this definition, I realized how important it is to watch my think-

ing even more diligently. For instance, if I should forget something, do I consider this delusional? If I practice and accept the teachings of Mrs. Eddy, whose teachings are based on those of Christ Jesus, yes, I am! I am resisting the understanding that I have the mind of Christ and the proven fact that I can know anything I need to know, when I need to know it. God is omniscient, and we are all created in His image and likeness.

If I see sin, disease, and death and accept them as real, I am delusional, for I am resisting the fact that what God creates is only good. I am being resistant to reason and to matters of fact. I am being resistant to the fact that Jesus cast out sin, disease and death as unreal and untrue!

If I believe that I am getting older, I believe that life is in matter instead of knowing my life is in God and that we are all ageless, diseaseless, and deathless because God made us so.

If I am seeing the political situation as hopeless, I'm believing in minds many, and therefore, I do not understand the fact that there is only one Mind and we are all governed by that Mind!

Certainly none of us would want to be delusional and let "a fixed, dominating or persistent false mental concept" take hold in our experience! It is important, then, to realize what is delusional and what is not, and to daily challenge what we might ordinarily accept as normal and natural, and to know that, if it is not of God, it is *not* normal, but needs to be cast out as an imposter! Christian Science *is* radical, and when we faithfully apply its healing Principle to our problems, we will find it to ever be the one answer which meets our every need and the needs of everyone, everywhere!
