When the Word is made flesh, — that is, rendered practical, — this eternal Truth will be understood; and sickness, sin, and death will yield to it, even as they did more than eighteen centuries ago. The lusts of the flesh and the pride of life will then be quenched in the divine Science of being; in the ever-present good, omnipotent Love, and eternal Life, that know no death. In the great forever, the verities of being exist, and must be acknowledged and demonstrated. Man must love his neighbor as himself, and the power of Truth must be seen and felt in health, happiness, and holiness: then it will be found that Mind is All-in-all, and there is no matter to cope with.

Man is free born: he is neither the slave of sense, nor a silly ambler to the so-called pleasures and pains of self-conscious matter. Man is God's image and likeness; whatever is possible to God, is possible to man as God's reflection. Through the transparency of Science we learn this, and receive it: learn that man can fulfill the Scriptures in every instance; and if he open his mouth it shall be filled — not by reason of the schools, or learning, but by the natur-

al ability, that reflection already has bestowed on him, to give utterance to Truth.

"Who hath believed our report?" Who understands these sayings? He to whom the arm of the Lord is revealed; to whom divine Science unfolds omnipotence, that equips man with divine power while it shames human pride. Asserting a selfhood apart from God, is a denial of man's spiritual sonship; for it claims another father. As many as do receive a knowledge of God through Science, will have power to reflect His power, in proof of man's "dominion over all the earth." He is bravely brave who dares at this date refute the evidence of material sense with the facts of Science, and will arrive at the true status of man because of it.

I recently felt compelled to read Psalm 138 in its entirety, since parts of it were in a recent Lesson — and I am glad I did. There are such powerful thoughts within each verse.

1. I will praise Thee with my whole heart: before the gods will I sing praise unto Thee.

I will be grateful to God and praise Him even while I am in the midst of family, friends, and when I am interacting with society at large. I will praise Him when I do something well, and I will praise Him when I mess up. I will know that knowledge and creativity and love come from Him, and I will be always grateful for it.

2. I will worship toward Thy holy temple, and praise Thy name for Thy lovingkindness and for Thy truth: for Thou hast magnified Thy word above all Thy name.

I am grateful to God for bringing me to this church and directing me to Truth. To have shown me such love when I was coming from my lowest point, cemented a need in me to do all I can for Him. Being here doing this work has, in turn, shown me I actually can have value in His plan.

3. In the day when I cried Thou answeredst me, and strengthenedst me with strength in my soul.

I remember that day so vividly — I was at the end and I called to Him. He answered immediately! From death to Life in moments. It took a while to fully understand it, but the immediate infusion of hope — and even joy! — was wonderful, and just in time.

4. All the kings of the earth shall praise Thee, O Lord, when they hear the words of Thy mouth.

I am able to listen to the news now because I know we have the Truth in the Bible, as well as Science and Health. I know that we have the mission to broadcast that message to the world. I know that every politician, celebrity, artist and businessman will feel unfulfilled until they know God's love. Body is the compound idea including all right ideas, and is therefore wholly spiritual, normal, complete, and perfect in the kingdom of heaven.

First Edition of Science and Health

In referring to the First Edition of Science and Health, Mary Baker Eddy described herself as "a scribe under orders," as thoughts came from God so quickly, she was barely able to write fast enough to set them all down. Of future editions of Science and Health she said, "I have hidden it, hidden it,"

The control mind holds over matter becomes no longer a question when with mathematical certainty we gain its proof, and can demonstrate the facts assumed. This proof we claim to have gained, and reduced to its statement in science that furnishes a key to the harmony of man, and reveals what destroys sickness, sin, and death.

Metaphysical science explains cause and effect; removing the veil of mystery and doubt, from Soul and body, and from man and God; it unwinds the interlaced ambiguities of Spirit and matter, and sets free the imprisoned Intelligence; explains the phenomenon man, on the basis of his Principle, and how to gain his harmony in science, which seems to us more important morally and physically than the discovery of the powers of steam, the electrical telegraph, or any other advanced idea that science has revealed.

We learn from science mind is universal, the first and only cause of all that really is; also, that the real and unreal constitute what is and what is not; that the real is Spirit, which is immortality, and the unreal matter, or mortality. The real is Truth, Life, Love and Intelligence, all of which are Spirit, and Spirit is God, and God, Soul, the Principle of the universe and man. Spirit is the only immortal basis.

Lives Transformed

Following are testimonies from people whose lives have been completely transformed by turning to God and independent Christian Science.

When I was a young girl I suffered from asthma. During an attack, I would gasp for air with all my might. So, I asked her, "Where is God?" Reminding me of what I had endured months earlier she replied, "When you want to know God just as much as, or even more than, you want air, then you will find Him!"

Years later, I was lost and confused because all of my material gods had forsaken — and thank God! Hungering and thirsting after righteousness, I stumbled across the Plainfield Church website — what a glorious day for me! I am so grateful for this church and for what I'm learning here. Since finding this church, my life has changed for the better, because I am changing for the better. Through the Bible Lessons, the weekly Bible Studies, the Roundtables, and the daily talks with a Plainfield practitioner, I am learning so much. I am growing in understanding and confi-

Watching Point No. 292 Gilbert C. Carpenter

WATCH that you send forth your scientific arrows of thought with power, and then protect them against reversal. The entire volume of electricity present in the atmosphere is back of each lightning bolt. In like manner we should realize that the entire power of God is back of every affirmation of Truth that we make. When you read the arguments Mrs. Eddy used or gave to students to use, you can feel that she sent them out with such power, that they reached the mark and destroyed the error, in spite of error's attempt to reverse and nullify them.

Once she declared, "Since malicious animal magnetism knows all the arguments of Christian Science, it is necessary to declare that no argument of mental malpractice can make null and void, antidote or reverse, any statement of Christian Science that you make."

This book is available through the Plainfield Christian Science Church, Independent. It is an invaluable study aid for advancing students of Christian Science, containing many of the articles written by Mr. Eustace during his practice and teaching of Christian Science.

Mr. Eustace graduated from the Massachusetts Metaphysical College in 1902 with the degree of C.S.B., signed by Mrs. Eddy and Mr. Edward Kimball. After that, Mr. Eustace served the Christian Science movement faithfully for many years, as Trustee of the Christian Science Publishing Society, practitioner, and teacher of Christian Science well into the 1930s.

The following paragraphs, handwritten by Mr. Eustace, were left on his desk as his last written word (December 9, 1957):

"Mrs. Eddy gave two very important directions to every Christian Scientist before saying good-bye; in fact they were more than directions, they were commands and demanded imperative obedience. The one was to call disease animal magnetism as the specific term for error or mortal mind, and then handle animal magnetism. And the other was that Christian Scientists are not healing because they do not know how to handle animal magnetism.

"Here is a challenge to you. Do you not know how to handle animal magnetism? If not, why not; and from this moment let your every intent be to know how to handle animal magnetism and then do it; and heal the sick intelligently and instantaneously, which is the only way Christian Science does."

The book is bound in flexible red leatherette and contains 1040 pages. The price is \$27.00.

Breaking Down Misconceptions of Christian Science

Concerning the nature of false oaths, and God's hatred of such things: among the biggest false oaths in history is the "oath of allegiance" which certain influential people must swear to the Boston Christian Science Church Board of Directors.

Can anyone in his/her right mind even begin to imagine Mrs. Eddy walking around her home — or visiting any local Christian Science branch or organization of her day — anxiously brandishing a formal paper demanding of anyone, great or small, that he/she sign it, swearing an oath of allegiance to her? Where on earth did Boston get such an idea in the first place? On one level, it's a notion worthy of a scene in a Gilbert and Sullivan operetta. On another level, it is not a trivial matter at all. From the Plainfield Church history:

"The harassment of the Plainfield Church began in 1975 when the Christian Science Board of Directors, following a pattern of the Board of Directors' interference in branch affairs, demanded that the Plainfield Church replace its highly respected Board of Trustees with a new Board willing to swear an oath of allegiance to the Boston Directors. In a vigorously worded response to this unwarranted interference in our church's internal affairs, the members rejected Boston's demand, pointing out to the Directors that they themselves were in violation of our Leader's Manual, specifically Article XXIII, Sections 1 and 10, and Article XI, Section 13...."

And yet, the other half of this problem (and arguably the bigger half, the larger problem) lies not with the oathextractors, but with the compliant enablers who agree to

take the oath. For the Scripture enjoins all would-be enablers: "Thou shalt not follow a multitude to do evil" (Ex. 23:2).

Thus, may the God of impossible things raise up courageous men and women throughout the nominal Christian Science world to summon the fortitude, the mettle, the stoutheartedness, the grace, the independence — to cease following the "multitude to do evil," to cease speaking for and defending a cause, following many, to divert judgment.

And in every area of my life, may God grant me the grace to uphold Christ's eternal integrity if ever I am faced with the temptation to "follow a multitude to do evil." Amen.

Hezekiah, Sennacherib, and Rabshakeh

Sennacherib, king of Assyria, wanted King Hezekiah and his people's obedience. Sennacherib sent Rabshakeh to Jerusalem to threaten Hezekiah and his people into obeying him. Sennacherib had defeated other nations, and he threatened to do the same to them, taunting them that the other nations' gods were not able to save them, and so Hezekiah's God would not be able to save him and his people.

This is much like what the Boston board of directors did to the Plainfield Church. They required that we pledge our allegiance to them, and be dependent upon them rather than on God; but Plainfield Church refused. Sennacherib wanted their dependence on him, not on God. But Hezekiah also did not buy it. The board of directors waged psychological warfare against Plainfield Church to try to intimidate us. There were demanding letters sent, and they even had uniformed sheriffs come to Mrs. Evans' house and the homes of the members of the Board of Trustees, to serve court papers on them. That's when the watches were started, because it was such a hot time. Mrs. Evans was unable to sleep at night, so members got up to pray for an hour all night long. At that time we didn't know it, but we later found out that Mrs. Eddy had watches done in her home.

The Battle Now Is Materialism Versus Spiritualism

This is now the same battle that goes on when an aggressive disease comes at someone. It's psychological warfare; it's a bully. But we have all the power of God. We have to be fighters. It will push you around until you push back — scream back at it with the truth. Bicknell Young, in "Death Overcome," tells how, when he was at the bottom of a lake, apparently drowned, that — even though he had lived a very good life — a voice kept telling him he was a rotten person. Being a good person isn't enough — he had to be tough and stand strong, and he argued back. The louder the voice accused him, the louder he argued back. Then he shot up out of the lake and was saved.

When Sennacherib's messenger, Rabshakeh, came after Hezekiah, he taunted him, reminding him how all the gods of the other nations were destroyed — but Hezekiah knew they were material gods, made by men's hands of wood and stone, not the true God! Hezekiah talked directly to God, and said he wanted the world to know how great God is, that He is the only true God, — not how great Hezekiah is. He was not looking for something for himself. Hezekiah didn't argue with Rabshakeh, he just turned to God. Don't argue with a person. Get rid of a sense of personality. The devil wants us to get into a personal battle. When the voice is coming at you in your head, fight back; but when talking to a person, don't argue. Personal sense does not comprehend God; the material mind just cannot understand.

God's Law of Righteousness Overcomes Fear

Hezekiah had a remarkable mother who instilled a love for God in him. He knew the gods of Assyria had no power, and he was not afraid of them. He was ready when the test came. He knew his God was real. Material sense

would say Hezekiah's people had had it — the army closing in on them was huge — they would be wiped out. But Hezekiah was standing up for the one God; the other nations who were defeated had their own personal agenda. Hezekiah had all the power of God behind him — that's God's law of righteousness. Hezekiah's attitude became one of defiance — he was all for God, with no fear.

The Bible says, "Some trust in chariots, and some in horses: but we will remember the name of the Lord our God." (Ps.) The "name" of the Lord is the "nature" of God. God is Love, which casts out fear; God is the only Mind. Go through the seven synonyms. Also, keep lists of healings where God's law has been proved in your life. Mrs. Eddy talks about the scale — is the scale balanced on God's side or not? People often focus on things that have gone wrong in their lives, and then things continue to go wrong! It takes a mighty effort to switch that scale and see all the good that's going on. What are you thinking about? Where is your scale? The Bible says, "Hitherto the Lord hath helped us, and hitherto He will." We don't have chariots and horses, but people sometimes worship and submit to wrong things like the "wisdom" of the medical profession and government, fearful predictions of weather — and then fear when it happens. That has to be overcome through total reliance on God. Do not give up, but patiently wait while working and knowing the truth, knowing our God is good, even though it may not look that way. If you keep at it, you'll see the false picture replaced with the right picture.

Prayer Made Practical

If there is stuff going around in your head and you can't seem to shake it — or in your neighborhood — it's not enough to just sit and pray about it. You have to do something; you have to speak up. Prayer is often accompanied

by action. Usually when you pray, you get directions from God. Our prayers should always include that listening. If you don't follow His directions, that's when anxiety starts. It's a matter of *doing* it. Just like if you called a practitioner and didn't do your part — it requires action, and change always.

"Wait on the Lord" is not waiting in a waiting room — it's listening to Him and obeying, and not being afraid to speak up. It's more like waiting on tables in a restaurant when you are serving God. If a mesmerism is going on, you need to stamp your foot if necessary. There is something required. When Jesus did healing work, he often required they do something: take up thy bed, stand up — some requirement to take action. When we don't take action, it's because we're paralyzed by animal magnetism. So get up and do something!

Let God's Light Shine Through You

The Bible says, the Lord is my light and my salvation. If we are letting our light shine, that's the Lord shining through us. It is getting a personal sense of self out of the way and letting God's light shine. For every bit of light we get, some darkness is dispelled.

The devil is not happy that Christian Science has a flicker of light. Error is nothing; God is all. That's what Hezekiah proved — be of good courage. Hezekiah was thinking of God in the big picture. Christian Science explains the essence of being for all mankind. What we are doing is vitally important for all mankind. The devil's biggest desire is to hide Mary Baker Eddy and her discovery. We have only the one God with us, and that is our majority. Keep on keeping on; be persistent. What we give out is vitally important and needs to be protected.

What Are We Watching For?

Jesus asked his disciples to watch with him in Gethsemane. Mary Baker Eddy had students in her home take watches at different times throughout the day and night. Many of us independent Christian Scientists from across the U.S. and abroad participate in "Unity Watches" several evenings a week. What is the big deal about watching?

First, let us differentiate between two types of watching. At a major sporting event, the stands are filled with those watching the game. They are there to enjoy the fun. Then there are those at the event who are watching against anything that might disturb the event or cause harm.

The first kind of watcher is akin to the one who enjoys the fact that God is good and loves His creation, etc. The second recognizes that we are in a mental warfare. The

Bible refers to it as "the flesh warring against the spirit." This watcher listens and feels for the "serpent," mental arguments that would discourage, demoralize, distract, that would claim that evil is more real than good, etc.

Is the second kind of watcher really necessary? Are the security guards really necessary at the sporting event?

Mary Baker Eddy warned that if the watching was not done, the world will fall into another 1900 years of darkness. Sounds important!

The following is a sample of submissions from the Lesson, "Doctrine of Atonement."

Constant self-immolation required.

The Christian Science "culture" loves to equate the doctrine of atonement with the "doctrine" of at-one-ment — like Christians who believe that the purification of baptism is achieved with a ceremony that sprinkles water on an infant.

But this Lesson makes no bones about it! "The atonement requires constant self-immolation on the sinner's part." (S&H) (Of course, as we learned last week, if you are righteous, none of this applies because you are already a perfect child of God, at one with Him — and hopelessly deluded!)

So our Doctrine of Atonement in Christian Science is not an annual repentance (as the Jewish tradition), or a vague theological platform (as the Christian tradition), but a "down and dirty," "rubber meets the road," moment-by-moment striving to relinquish material, self-centered thinking, and to identify more and more with the image, the reflection, of God, immortal man.

Lesson Forum

Response:

"... get out of man into God, to reach the science of Life and be rid of sickness, sin and death... (S&H, First Edition)

This clearly shows that self-immolation (sacrifice), self-abnegation (denial) are imperative. I am seeing more than ever that the correct understanding of this, through the moment-by-moment practice of this requirement, is what distinguishes a true follower, Christian or Christian Scientist, from who may profess to be one. This is what brings me to the correct identification with "true being," without which I cannot see my union with Christ, Spirit.

Response:

Malachi saw this very clearly in his prophecy of Jesus' coming: "who shall stand when he appeareth? for he is like a refiner's fire, and like fullers' soap." Who is going to stand to have their pride burned out? And have their most cherished selfish human desires torn out from beneath them and purified? Self-immolation is not a pleasant experience. It hurts when it happens, but the benefits of going through it are priceless!

Mrs. Evans used to refer to the "ring of fire." This was the phenomenon whereby people would find Plainfield and Christian Science, and love it. Then, after a while, they would be required (by God) to burn out whatever needed to be burned out. Some would be willing to take the heat, but some were not, and they would leave. I don't think this "ring of fire" ever really leaves us. It is God requiring us to be what He made.

Response:

Who can be at one, in union, or claim to be the child of God, without the necessary purification, since only our

"true-being" is at-one or the reflection of God? Christ Jesus lived the Christ that we may also follow: "through the revelation and demonstration of life in God, hath elevated them to possible at-one-ment with the spiritual idea of man and his divine Principle, Love." (S&H)

Response:

But the self-immolation isn't so that we save "self" — right? It's to put it off. Not to purify self, but to deprive it of life so it is destroyed and only God's self and its expression is left.

I think that's key — if we approach self-immolation as denying ourselves this pleasure or that pleasure, in order to be pure, we're still holding onto self.

Constant self-immolation means watching that I'm awake, and not in the dream of self. And recognizing the little ways self tries to hang around and justify.

Response:

The purification in the process is to have a pure consciousness that can reflect God. "Blessed are the pure in heart: for they shall see God." There can be nothing material in that reflection since the substance of Christ is utterly Spirit!

"Thou couldest have no power at all against me, except it were given thee from above."

Jesus went through the crucifixion to show us what is possible, or should we better say, what is true!! The worst hatred directed towards his Christliness resulted in what? A magnificent resurrection, proving for all time, evil is not person, place, or thing; and once overcome as such, we gain reality — and it is very good! — Straight from Genesis 1, when creation was completed.
