Self-Immolation

And it is the most rewarding work that anyone can do. The sacrifices of "self" are the burning off of selfishness, self-righteousness, self-love, etc. These are the things that prevent us from realizing our highest good, our greatest potential, for they keep us from hearing and obeying God. We should rejoice when we burn them away and let the light of Truth shine on our hearts.

And if it seems painful at times to have these "self' hindrances burned off, that only shows that we are clinging to them and need to let go. Whenever I react to a rebuke, I now recognize it as a sign that something has been hit that needs to be burned away. It wasn't always so. And if I seem to be "losing" something or someone that I cherish, put it in God's hands and let Him determine what is really best for me. This is how selfishness and all the other "selfs" are burned away – self-immolated. This is a process that is definitely worth practicing, for the rewards are unspeakable. ***********

Present Your Bodies

"Paul had a clear sense of the demands of Truth upon mortals physically and spiritually, when he said: 'Present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service.' But he, who is begotten of the beliefs of the flesh and serves then, can never reach in this world the divine heights of our Lord." (Science and *Health*). This is such an interesting statement – to present your BODIES a living sacrifice. I sometimes ask myself this question – am I giving my body wholly in service to God? Do I trust him for all my needs in this regard? Do I trust Him to feed, clothe etc. and to keep my body in perfect working order? Or am I looking to matter and material laws for this aid – always checking, probing, weighing, exercising? If so I will never reach the "divine heights of our Lord." We are also admonished to be "absent from the body and present with the Lord." In service to Him – this is always the best and only way to live. Sing and memorize hymn #324. It is a wonderful reminder to present our entire self in total obedience to Our Maker! *********

Thank you. I have thought about how to give my body as a reasonable living sacrifice and then be absent from this body...give it and then let it be ... be with God. I like the hymn because it tells us HOW to do this and then my favorite part," I am Thine, and I will be EVER, ONLY ALL FOR THEE." Dead: Perfectly still; motionless. Empty; vacant;

Unemployed; useless; unprofitable. Dull; inactive; (Which Elijah proved Baal was) *********

It has Been Proven

Matthew 26

36 Then cometh Jesus with them unto a place called Gethsemane, and saith unto the disciples, Sit ye here, while I go and pray yonder.

37 And he took with him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, and began to be sorrowful and very heavy.

38 Then saith he unto them, My soul is exceeding sorrowful, even unto death: tarry ye here, and watch with me.

39 And he went a little further, and fell on his face, and prayed, saying, O my Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me: nevertheless not as I will, but as thou wilt.

Spiritual Signification

Science and Health, p 32 The true sense is spiritually lost, if the sacrament is confined to the use of bread and wine. The disciples had eaten, yet Jesus prayed and gave them bread. This would have been foolish in a literal sense; but in its spiritual signification, it was natural and beautiful. Jesus prayed; he withdrew from the material senses to refresh his heart with brighter, with spiritual views. Science and Health, p 33 Let not the flesh, but the Spirit, be represented in me.

Our unity with God is spiritual, our likeness as His image and likeness is spiritual. It is the spiritual self that is forever; it is that which is real, true and when understood and adhered to consistently gain us our freedom of perfection.

Hence our striving MUST be to emerge from the material sense of self and material view of things for the exchange of the correct view of things; for the ability to discern through our spiritual sense. This we must do, to follow Christ's example. There

is no connection of this moral deceptive self with the Christ; and we sure cannot help ourselves and others by holding on to our material history and applying the Truth to it. Perfect God, perfect man, as the basis of healing and demonstration is about our already existing spiritual perfection. *******

Consecration to Christ

Science and Health, p 28:10-11 "One's consecration to Christ is more on the ground of demonstration than of profession." It's not about just talking but doing for, helping, loving our brother as Christ did. It's all about giving. Hymn 324 says, "Take my life, and let it be Consecrated, Lord, to Thee." This other rule of the thumb is what I have been using lately: GOOD is All, so I am experiencing GOOD, only. There is nothing else to experience, besides mortal delusion. We may well be perplexed at human fear; and still more astounded at hatred, which lifts its hydra head, showing its horns in the many inventions of evil. But why should we stand aghast at nothingness?" As we begin to obtain the divine sense that "harmony is the real and discord the unreal" – this viewpoint will not be callous or unfeeling, but be so filled with God's Love for His creation the false concept will disappear and give place to the real and eternal. As our hymn states, "From sense to Soul my pathway lies before me, from mist and shadow into Truth's clear day..." Don't let the mesmeric picture deceive you into believing its lie. *******
