What is Truth?

Science and Health p. 223: 14-24.

The question, "What is Truth," convulses the world. Then it says: The efforts of error to answer this question by some ology are vain.

The word convulses is very strong. From Websters 1828 the second definition gives this: 2. To shake; to affect by violent irregular action.

It is through Christian Science that I began to think of God as Truth. Truth knows no evil or no falsehoods. It is light that does reveal all error. From Webster's 1828 dictionary, to cultivate: to till, to improve by study or labor, to refine and improve by correction of faults.

The "cultivating" is the eternal striving for deeper understanding and knowing of God's nature and our true being, which teaches our freedom from all ills. No one can finish this eternal work! But the continual persistence, joyous or painful finding out, knowing and loving what is true leads us on! *****

Hides the Divine Possibilities

"When first spoken in any age, Truth, like the light, 'shineth in darkness, and the darkness comprehended it not.' A false sense of life, substance, and mind hides the divine possibilities, and conceals scientific demonstration." (Science and Health) The sun is always shining, even when the clouds obscure our vision of it. So it is with God - His Love for His creation is always pouring forth to bless all. It is only our misconceptions about Him, our false beliefs about what really constitutes our true being that shuts our eyes to these blessings. Thank God for Mrs. Eddy and for Christian Science which opens the blinded eye so we may behold "the way, the truth and the life" as shown to us by Christ Jesus. The divine possibilities are always present – don't let error keep you from seeing what is right before you! ************

I'm thankful for our most recent roundtable discussion about the importance of looking. Renounce the Hidden Things

The sentence in the Bible citation goes on to give us some clues as to what is really at work to create the hidden things of dishonesty: "not walking in craftiness, nor handling the word of God deceitfully;"

Mrs. Eddy tells us that one of the requirements for practicing Christian Science is unselfed love. Selfishness is the downfall of every Christian. Those who strive to promote themselves, or to use Christian Science for personal gain or benefit, are "handling the word of God deceitfully." It can't work, because selfishness is a belief in many human minds, a belief that good is not infinite, and that it is material, not spiritual. This is all self-deception, handling the word of God deceitfully, which is ultimately dishonest for a Christian. The standard of Christian Science is "perfect God and perfect man" (*Science and Health*, 259), which excludes selfishness.

Spirit of The Lord

In Philippians 2 we read, "Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus:" and Mrs. Eddy writes, "The divine Mind that made man maintains His own image and likeness. The human mind is opposed to God and must be put off, as St. Paul declares." Brain research is all about matter and personality, with no God in it.

Love From God - An Honor and A Trust

Unselfed

Science and Health, p. 192: 30-31. Whatever holds human thought in line with unselfed love, receives directly the divine power.

Here at Plainfield Church, I am beginning to understand what unselfed love really is. In the past, I thought unselfed love was letting people have their own way, and always giving to the point of not taking care of what I thought was really moral or just. Unselfed is being wholly obedient to God! This is a whole new way of living and thinking. ***

In order to be obedient to his commands, to "love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind" and "love thy neighbor as thyself," I need to watch my thinking and keep it aligned with God. When I react in anger, hate, stand aghast, fear or self-pity, I am allowing the opposition to make me feel separated from God, which makes my work for God seem ineffective. Then I have allowed it to rob my working thought.

His Commandments Are Not Grievous

"For this is the love of God, that we keep His commandments: and His commandments are not grievous." (I John) That word "grievous" means "heavy, oppressive, burdensome." It is clearly the ploy of the devil to turn things upside down in such a fashion so that John needed to point out God's commandments are never grievous. How could the commandments of God be considered burdensome? - and yet I have known some who think anything to do with God is somehow pure drudgery! The very opposite is true – NOT obeying God and His commandments leads to pure drudgery and enslavement. Obedience to God brings peace, joy, and a purposeful life. Error is very tricky and would try to deceive "the very elect."! This is why it is so important to know the Bible and become familiar with our loving Father-Mother God. "What doth the Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?" (Micah)

Glorify God

Ten Lepers were healed. They asked for mercy, for help and Jesus healed them. Only one returned to give thanks. This one leper gave God the honor and the power for his healing. He felt the love of God and was compelled to return his love to God through gratitude. Mrs. Eddy asks, "Are we REALLY grateful for the good already received?" If a challenge in my life occurs and I become stuck on overcoming the challenge I am actually preventing the healing. I am forgetting all that God has done for me. I am no better than the nine lepers! How selfish!

It is a must to thank God! Honoring God by recognizing God as the only power enables me to be open for more blessings. It gives me the opportunity to help others. True gratitude, not just words, but heartfelt gratitude to God for past blessings, breaks the mesmerism of the present challenge and keeps me on the straight and narrow path. It brings hope and prevents discouragement. When I give gratitude to God it fills me with love and joy. Just like the grateful leper, I also feel the connection with God and all that He has created and for this I am eternally grateful. *********

These Words... Shall Be In Thine Heart

Deuteronomy 6 is instructive in practical ways to stay with God as we go about our days. Reading Matthew Henry's commentary, he had this to say, "He that loves God loves his Bible." I love how simple and true this is!

And he goes on to say: "Pious discourse. "Thou shalt talk of these things, with due reverence and seriousness, for the benefit not only of thy children, but of thy other domestics, thy friends and companions, as thou sittest in thy house at work, or at meat, or at rest, or to receive visits, and when thou walkest by the way for diversion, or for conversation, of in journeys, when at night thou art retiring from thy family to lie down for sleep, and

when in the morning thou hast risen up and returnest to thy family again. Take all occasions to discourse with those about thee of divine things; not of unrevealed mysteries, or matters of doubtful disputation, but of the plain truths and laws of God, and the things that belong to our peace."

I know that it's only relatively recently that I've shared Bible truths, and Christian Science (aka the Laws of the Universe, or "the plain truths and laws of God") with others—and most people are not only receptive, but grateful and comforted to hear. When I think of how I kept these things mostly to myself for so many years! But I'm now making up for lost time and sharing "the things that belong to our (to my) peace."... "for the more conversant we are with them the more we shall admire them and be affected with them, and may thereby be instrumental to communicate divine light and heat."

When the words are in my heart, then I can share my heart with others. (It's far from being "preachy" which usually doesn't go down well at all). And this world sure could use more people sharing their hearts with others! (Like what happens at our Wednesday testimony meetings)!
