## Science and Health, p 149: 3-7

"Mind as far outweighs drugs in the cure of disease as in the cure of sin. The more excellent way is divine Science in every case. Is *materia medica* a science or a bundle of speculative human theories?"

This is such a powerful lesson!! This whole section from *Science and Health* tells us in a nutshell what the stance should be when disease, sin, etc. comes knocking at our doors. "Mind as far outweighs drugs in the cure of disease as in the cure of sin,"

#### **Obedience to Truth**

"Obedience to Truth gives man power and strength. Submission to error superinduces loss of power." (*Science and Health*, p.183).

We have been discussing a lot the last few weeks about that power which comes from God and obeying Him and challenging anything that would take us down the road of negative victim thinking, a loss of power. Gideon did not roll up in a ball of hopelessness when faced by the terror of the invaders, but responded to God's call to overthrow the idol of Baal in his camp and face the enemy

under God's direction. We are warned at length about the downfall of blame and victim thinking and the importance of not forgetting the moral and spiritual law. This week's Lesson covers obedience to moral and spiritual law, which gives strength, healing, and a way out. Mrs. Eddy tells us if we submit to error, we lose power. This is exactly what I am doing when I blame and feel the victim. It can be very hard to break the mesmerism of this negative thinking, but thanks to Christ Jesus, Mrs. Eddy, and this church, we have practical strategies.

The moral law tells me to follow the First Commandment. I can catch myself starting to blame. Instead of entering the negative zone, I can ask myself, "Do I want to stay stuck?" "What or who am I giving power/control over me that is not God?" "What am I excusing?" "Where am I placing my happiness?" I can attack victim thinking with specific Truths. I can be proactive and make choices. Talk with God. Memorize Scripture and lines from Mrs. Eddy's writings. Be grateful. Do work for God. Ask God, "What do I need to do here?" This is just a small list of things that we have been given to do. \*\*\*\*\*\*\*

The early part of the Book of Isaiah makes vivid the curses that befall God's people for the sin of idolatry. The latter part of Isaiah makes equally vivid the blessings that overtake God's people as a natural result of destroying their idols and returning to God. These blessings and cursings are mentioned throughout the law of Moses, most especially Deuteronomy 28.

"I have . . . saved . . . when there was no strange god among you: therefore ye are my witnesses, saith the LORD, that I am God" (Isaiah 43:12).

This is why the reforms of Gideon and Hezekiah parallel each other, as do the great victories following those reforms. The inside enemy must be dealt with first; this being done, victory over any outside enemy becomes a very simple matter, indeed.

"The idols of civilization are far more fatal to health and longevity than are the idols of barbarism" (*Science and Health*, p.173:30-31).

Just one example of such idolatry: opioid use has become so widespread that these substances are now polluting municipal water supplies of major American cities. Prenatal exposure to opioids has resulted in babies addicted at birth.

"If God created drugs good, they cannot be harmful; if He could create them otherwise, then they are bad and unfit for man; and if He created drugs for healing the sick, why did not Jesus employ them and recommend them for that purpose?" (Misc. 25:27-31.)

#### Seek and be Guided

Deuteronomy 4: 29 But if from thence thou shalt seek the Lord thy God, thou shalt find him, if thou seek him with all thy heart and with all thy soul. Isaiah 58: 11 ...the Lord shall guide thee continually, and satisfy thy soul in drought, and make fat thy bones: and thou shalt be like a watered garden, and like a spring of water, whose waters fail not. This Lesson makes it perfectly clear that when you seek God with your whole being and look to no other idols ancient or modern, you shall be guided ... and fail not.

## **Blessed Are They**

"Blessed are they that do his commandments, that they may have right to the tree of life, and may enter in through the gates into the city."

Revelation 22: 14

This law of obedience to God is stated from beginning to end in the Bible and in this week's Lesson. We see the progression from the Ten Commandments of Moses to the Blessed Are They of Jesus and John's Revelation, from the relative to the absolute. In Science and Health (cit. 2, p. 140) Mrs. Eddy states, "We shall obey and adore in proportion as we apprehend the divine nature and love Him understandingly, warring no more over the corporeality, but rejoicing in the affluence of our God." # **SUBJECT: Doctrine of Atonement – October 21st, 2018**

## **Atonement as Alignment**

"Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly..." (Col. 3:16.)

"...the Word, the polar magnet of Revelation..." (Science and Health, p.575:27.)

Physically, the definitions of magnetism and gravity are different, but metaphysically they indicate two aspects of the same universal principle discussed virtually everywhere in Mrs. Eddy's writings: the law of attraction. Law of attraction is, briefly: "that which is like unto itself is drawn." In other words, I become what I fasten my gaze upon.

"Where shall the gaze rest?" (*Science and Health*, p.264:9.)

"...we must first turn our gaze in the right direction, and then walk that way. We must form perfect models in thought and look at them continually..." (*Science and Health*, p.248:25-27)

In painting a portrait of Jesus, I can't be occupied with the specter of Judas. This same principle of single-mindedness applies to the sculptor and his model. (*Science and Health*, p.260:3-6, 248:12-26.)

"Man walks in the direction towards which he looks, and where his treasure is, there will his heart be also." (*Science and Health*, p.451:14.)

"We must look where we would walk, and we must act as possessing all power from Him in whom we have our being." (*Science and Health*, p.264:10-12.)

"Mortals must gravitate Godward...in order that sin and mortality may be put off." (*Science and Health*, p.265:5-9.)

"If man's spiritual gravitation and attraction to one Father, in whom we 'live, and move, and have our being,' should be lost, and if man should be governed by corporeality instead of divine Principle, by body instead of by Soul, man would be annihilated." (*Science and Health*, p.536:11-16.)

When an ordinary piece of iron is rubbed against a magnet, the former's electrons become aligned — moving in one direction only — where they had previously been moving randomly, in all directions. Thus, ordinary metal takes on the characteristics of the magnet with which it comes in contact.

By exposing myself continually to the polar magnet of the Word, I cannot help but to align all of my misaligned "mortal feelings, motives, affections, joys, and sorrows" with their immortal counterparts (*Science and Health*, p.587:23-24). Death to self is death to all of self's omni-directional misalignments with the things of God.

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"Mortal feelings, motives, affections, joys, and sorrows" are Mrs. Eddy's definition for "Heart" in *Science and Health*. This led me to Matthew 6:21, "For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." And my favorite from *James 4*:8: "Draw nigh to God, and he will draw nigh to you."

We are constantly being pulled in one direction or another, and it is always thinking of God's Will that keeps us or gets us back on course. I love the idea of the "polar magnet of the Word"— the voice of God being truly the ultimate attraction. \*\*\*\*\*\*\*

## **Daily Walk and Conversation**

"If Truth is overcoming error in your daily walk and conversation.... This is having our part in the at-one-ment with Truth and Love." by Mary Baker Eddy, *Science and Health*, p. 21

The word humility and pride popped out to me in this Lesson. The Website biblestudytools.com stated Pride-"stands in contrast to the word 'humble,' " and "is preferring self-will to God's will," and "shifts ultimate confidence from God to self."

In this week's Lesson, in *Luke 23: 39-43*, we get a picture of the crucifixion – the derision, the mocking, the casting of lots...
