Unimpeachable Perfection

I love this Lesson on Reality.

I was struck by Mrs. Eddy's sentence, "Remember that man's perfection is real and unimpeachable..."

Two things: It's REAL, not just some kind of theory. And a curious word, "unimpeachable." In the 1828 dictionary, the definition is, "That cannot be called in question." So man's perfection, is REAL and cannot be called into question!

To me that is very comforting to know, and I must know this as the truth about EVERY man's true spiritual nature.

Then, I can strive to walk in Jesus' footsteps: "The divine nature was best expressed in Christ Jesus, who threw upon mortals the truer reflection of God and lifted their lives higher than their poor thoughtmodels would allow, — thoughts which presented man as fallen, sick, sinning, and dying." (p. 259)

I love that he "threw upon mortals the truer reflection of God"! I must see through to the reality of the unimpeachable perfection of those I meet each day.

We Will Not Serve Thy Gods

"Nebuchadnezzar spake and said unto them, *Is it* true, O Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-nego, do not ye serve my gods, nor worship the golden image

which I have set up? ... be it known unto thee, O king, that we will not serve thy gods, nor worship the golden image which thou hast set up." Daniel 3

(Jeremiah calls Nebuchadnezzar the "destroyer of nations" (Jeremiah 4:7) and gives an account of the second siege of Jerusalem (587 BC) and the looting and destruction of the Solomon's Temple.

Nebuchadnezzar was a king of Ancient Babylon; Babylon appears in the Bible as a symbol for rejection of God and was know for the worship of many gods, such as Baal.)

Heathen: A pagan; a gentile; one who worships idols, or is unacquainted with the true God.

This week, I found myself asking, "What heathen thought am I allowing to dictate my life?" This could come in the form of fearful thoughts, people pleasing behavior, negative messages, others' opinions, compromise, dominating person, etc. I see why pressure is something to be alert to. Sometimes it comes under the guise of love. We are taught here to ask, "Where is this thought taking me?"

The three Hebrew captives did not allow Nebuchadnezzar (a bully or animal magnetism) and his pagan ideas to take them away from their relationship to the one true God and they did not compromise under pressure.

The blessing for following the First Commandment and putting God first and standing for the right:

Dan 3:25......Lo, I see four men loose, walking in the midst of the fire, and they have no hurt; and the form of the fourth is like the Son of God.

We Are Not Careful To Answer Thee

Daniel 3

1 Nebuchadnezzar the king made an image of gold,

14 ... and said unto them, *Is it* true, O Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-nego, do not ye serve my gods, nor worship the golden image which I have set up?

16 Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-nego, answered and said to the king, O Nebuchadnezzar, we are not careful to answer thee in this matter.

17 If it be so, our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the burning fiery furnace, and he will deliver us out of thine hand, O king.
18 But if not, be it known unto thee, O king, that we will not serve thy gods, nor worship the golden image which thou hast set up.

Thinking this week about things I've learned here, such as "agree with thy adversary quickly" and using wisdom when we go about our daily life, I wondered what the difference was here, that such a strong stand was required. I then remembered Christ Jesus' words: "Render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's." (Mark 12:17)

Those three knew that our God is God, and thus our worship, allegiance, and salvation are His. In going about my daily life, it would never be wise to give any of those away! Thus, there was no difference – they did agree quickly by basically saying, 'You are right, we won't serve or worship your false god.'

When my kids were small, I learned the value of the phrase, "Choose your battles." Not everything presented requires strong words and actions. Like with kids, when an aggressive claim is presenting itself, often it seems laughter or a hug is what is required to get back to joy and clear thinking. But, as I am learning here, there are times that Principle demands "we are not careful to answer" mortal mind, and know that Truth, Life, and Love "will deliver us out of thine hand, O [error]."

I am very grateful to be learning this, and to know that when these moments happen, there will come afterward a great blessing, just as came to Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-nego. Thank you for this lesson!

How are veritable ideas to be distinguished from illusions? By learning the origin of each. Ideas are emanations from the divine Mind. Allow Nothing But His Likeness To Abide In Thy Thought

We simply cannot allow the **unreal** to abide in our thinking! We do not search the Internet to understand "the claims that come" but we sure must search the right sources for the deeper understanding of certain words like "hate" which if not fully understood, can be passed for something benign and remain "unhandled" and grow until it shows up in various troubling forms. Example is what hatred entails according to a source that says "Dictionary:" intense dislike or will.

Synonyms:loathing, detestation, dislike, distaste, abhorrence, abomination, execration, resentment, aversion, hostility, ill will, ill feeling, bad feeling; enmity, animosity, antagonism, antipathy, bitterness, animus, revulsion, disgust, contempt, repugnance, odium, rancor; rare disrelish; and another form that can be easily hidden, INDIFFERENCE!

In Gal. 5 we are given the things of Spirit which we MUST fill our thoughts with and the evil thoughts that we must purge from our thinking:

18 But if ye be led of the Spirit, ye are not under the law.

19 Now the works of the flesh are manifest, which are these; Adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lasciviousness,

20 Idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, variance, emulations, wrath, strife, seditions, heresies,

21 Envyings, murders, drunkenness, revellings, and such like: of the which I tell you before, as I have also told you in time past, that they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God.

22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith,

23 Meekness, temperance: **against such there is no law. (Emphasis added)**

"Purge: To cleanse, remove what is offensive; get rid of, to sweep away impurities.

Fill: to put or pour in, till the thing will hold no more, store; to supply with abundance." (Websters 1828)

Purge thought of hate and fill thought with the fruit of the Spirit, "Against such there is no law" so I can "...be a law to yourselves that mental malpractice cannot harm you either when asleep or when awake." (*Science and Health*, p. 442)

In Quietness and in Confidence

"For thus saith the Lord GOD, the Holy One of Israel: In returning and rest shall ye be saved; in quietness and in confidence shall be your strength. (Isaiah 30) I have always loved the feeling of peace this verse has given me but more and more I am beginning to understand how important this concept is. In today's world, it is so easy to be continually "plugged" in to some electronic device! How often do we actually spend in quietness which then brings about confidence in God's ever presence and power? God is always speaking to us, but it requires a stillness of being to hear this "still small voice" of Truth.

Mrs. Eddy says in Collectanea, "Study to be quiet." I once puzzled as to what this really means, but I now understand it does take effort to be quiet, to silence mortal mind and all it's chatter. To quiet myself and to be still is so well worth the effort, for as Mrs. Eddy writes in her chapter on Prayer, "To enter into the heart of prayer, the door of the erring senses must be closed. Lips must be mute and materialism silent, that man [you!] may have audience with Spirit, the divine Principle, Love, which destroys all error." (Science and Health, p. 15) How awesome is that?!
