Broken Spirit

Golden Text: Psalm 51:17

"The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit: a broken and a contrite heart."

This made me think about the first Beatitude: Blessed are the poor in spirit: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Matthew 5:3

Webster's 1828 dictionary defines "break" (broken) – to subdue the passions; to train to obedience; to make tractable, as to break a horse.

I love Hymn 69; it often helps me to subdue unruly errors:

"Give me, O Lord, an understanding heart,
That I may learn to know myself in Thee,
To spurn the wrong and choose the better part
And thus from sinful bondage be set free.
Give me, O Lord, a meek and contrite heart,
That I may learn to quell all selfish pride,
Bowing before Thee, see Thee as Thou art

Give me, O Lord, a gentle, loving heart, That I may learn to be more tender, kind, And with Thy healing touch, each wound and smart

With Christly bands of Love and Truth to bind."

Abide in the Morale of Truth

"One must abide in the *morale* of truth or he cannot demonstrate the divine Principle." S & H p. 456

Biblical definitions of "abide" -1. to remain stable or fixed in a state of love; to stand firm; to continue in a place; 2. to conform to the rules; 3. to accept without objection; to acquiesce in will.

Definition of "morale" – a sense of common purpose. A good example is the mission of our church.

"Be firm in your understanding that the divine Mind governs, and that in Science man reflects God's government." (*Science and Health*, p. 393:16)

"Embosomed deep in Thy dear love, Held in Thy law, I stand." (Hymn 134) Such a beautiful lesson! Thank you, Lesson-writer.

Open Your Ears

"To those buried in the belief of sin and self, living only for pleasure or the gratification of the senses, he said in substance: Having eyes ye see not, and having ears ye hear not; lest ye should understand and be converted, and I might heal you. He taught that the material senses shut out Truth and its healing power." by Mary Baker Eddy, *Science and Health*, page 38: 26-32

There has been much instruction at Plainfield about the necessity of learning to listen to God. I am learning that it is impossible to live this Science of Christ without hearing God and following His messages. The above citation from our Lesson this week shows the connection of self-centered beliefs and shutting out Truth. Shutting out is to prevent. The opposite are the qualities such as facilitate, unclog, cultivate, encourage, foster, nurture, promote, allow, let, permit.

Sunday's Roundtable addressed the need to unself thought. There are many tools and instructions here to help us do this. Listening to the birds the other day, the idea came to me that the birds are singing for all to hear. Some don't hear them because they don't focus on the sound, perhaps are distracted, uninterested, or blocked out by earphones. Many lovers of birds seek out the sounds and can identify them. There is a teaching testimony by Mary Beth Singleterry posted on the Website, *How to Hear God's Messages*, that got me thinking about whether I was really working on hearing God's voice which is always there, like the birds.

Is My Relationship with God MOST Important?

Luke 14: 27 And whosoever doth not bear his cross, and come after me, cannot be my disciple. 33 So likewise, whosoever he be of you that forsaketh not all that he hath, he cannot be my disciple.

What can't I give up for Christ's sake? Put in other words, Is my relationship with God the most important thing above all else? This question starts some deep examining of my honest commitment to God. I found to what extent certain family ties and traditions would challenge this commitment. But to think that all that is required to be given up are those things that bind us to the "flesh;" what needs to go for each of us to own our true heritage of Life in God, Spirit. This includes the wrong material concepts of man, birth, death, our relationships to each other, holidays, etc..

Christ Jesus and Mary Baker Eddy both showed great examples of how we should answer this question. They both protesting against all evil (in this sense, evil is anything fleshly...false material senses,) bore the cross and won the crown. Am I doing this? I am grateful that I find my answers by sincerely praying for my Father's will, not my will to be done. That puts Him first and gives me peace. This makes a disciple....a follower.

SUBJECT: Life - July 21st, 2019

Life Abundant

"John 10: 9,10 I am the door: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved, and shall go in and out, and find pasture.

10 I am come that they might have **life**, and that **they might have** *it* **more abundantly.**" (Emphasis added)

Life abundant. Abundant from Webster's 1828 means Plentiful; in great quantity; fully sufficient; as an abundant supply. In scripture, abounding; having in great quantity; overflowing with.

Meaning no limitations, no imperfections, nothing that interferes with the fullness of this Life! Fears, sins, falsehoods of any kind, pains, colds, accidents, lack of money, strength, recreation, right companions, all have nothing to do with true Life. So, if any of these suggestions tempt, I have a right to ask... "Where is my abundant Life?" What am I permitting to steal that Christ given Life abundant from me?

Thank God, Mary Baker Eddy, through Christian Science, has explained how Christ Jesus taught that all can have this. They have both taught us what true Life is; it is Eternal, not in matter, "Life is not limited." See *Science and Health*, page 468.

Only as I claim my Christ-Mind, which is the All Knowing, can I see my ONENESS with God and not deny myself the Life that is abundant.

"God *is* with thee in all that thou doest." (Genesis 21:22)***********

cit. 11. 264: 28-31

A couple of citations from the Bible and *Science* and *Health* completely destroy evil's seeming victory over Truth: Psalm 34:

21 Evil shall slay the wicked: and they that hate the righteous shall be desolate.

22 The LORD redeemeth the soul of his servants: and none of them that trust in him shall be desolate. From Science and Health, p. 239: "The wicked man is not the ruler of his upright neighbor. Let it be understood that success in error is defeat in Truth. The watchword of Christian Science is Scriptural: 'Let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts.""

Many Bible stories affirm the victory of those who walked humbly with their God trusting all to Him and doing as He directs. From Divinity Course and General Collectanea, The Bluebook, pg. 228

"Never resent a wound from anyone, but always leave it to God, to **avenge and heal**. He will rightly reward; you cannot. Forgiveness is forgetfulness of sin, disease and all error in others and in ourselves. No wrong is forgiven until it is forgotten.
