From Essays and Other Footprints by Richard Oakes "Assembled Statements"

When asked who would take charge of the cause of Christian Science in time to come, Mrs. Eddy answered, according to Henry Robinson's Biographical Sketch: That question has resolved itself into a fatal mistake. I do not carry on the work myself. It is only through the influence of the Lord that I do it, and the Lord is the one who will carry it on. There is no more speculation on how the work will be carried on in the future than there is on what the future discoveries in astronomy will show, or what will be done in the nebulae. Why it is an infinite subject. So speculation is void. My life has been such a demonstration of this that it would amaze you.

Report of the Clerk The Annual Meeting 1906 From Miscellany, p. 48-49

Not until nineteen centuries had passed was there one ready to receive the inspiration, to restore to human consciousness the stone that had been rejected, and which Mrs. Eddy made "the head of the corner" of The Church of Christ, Scientist.

With the reading of her textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," Mrs. Eddy insisted that her students make, every day, a prayerful study of the Bible, and obtain the spiritual understanding of its promises. Upon this she founded the future growth of her church, and twenty-six years later the following splendid appreciation of her efforts appeared in the *Methodist Review* from the pen of the late Frederick Lawrence Knowles: —

"Mrs. Eddy . . . in her insistence upon the constant daily reading of the Bible and her own writings, . . . has given to her disciples a means of spiritual development which . . . will certainly build such truth as they do gain into the marrow of their characters. The scorn of the gross and sensual, and the subordination of merely material to spiritual values, together with the discouragement of care and worry, are all forces that make for righteousness. And they are burned indelibly upon the mind of the neophyte every day through its reading. The intellects of these people are not drugged by scandal, drowned in frivolity, or paralyzed by sentimental fiction. . . . They feed the higher nature through the mind, and I am bound as an observer of them to say, in all fairness, that the result is already manifest in their faces, their conversation, and their bearing, both in public and private. What wonder that when these smiling people say, 'Come thou with us, and we will do thee good,' the hitherto half-persuaded one is wholly drawn over, as by an irresistible attractor. The religious body which can direct, and control, in no arbitrary sense, but through sane counsel, the reading of its membership, stands a great chance of sweeping the world within a generation."

Awakening

When I first joined Plainfield Church I was still a regular attendee in my branch church. But the veil was slowly lifting from my eyes and I was beginning to feel — literally — Truth in my thought, perhaps for the first time.

The Plainfield Lesson was different. I couldn't put my finger on what was different about the Lesson because both churches use the King James version of the Bible and Science and Health.

One Sunday morning before church in the local branch, I got a very uneasy feeling, which increased during the service. As soon as the Second Reader gushed a verse from Psalms, the light broke through and I saw revealed to me for the first time ever, that the Lesson was incomplete.

The Boston version of Christian Science focuses on the goodness of God — too much so. They were skipping over the real crux of the Science — that evil must be uncovered so that it can then be seen as unreal. It was like a bolt of lightning in my thought. The entire movement across the world was reading and praying with an incomplete view of what this Science requires from us.

This week's Lesson reminded me of something I am so grateful for: the complete and accurate teaching and living at Plainfield of Mary Baker Eddy's discovery. This is no little thing.

I would be remiss if I didn't glorify the fact that Plainfield is AWAKE and sharing the complete and whole truth of God and this Science.

Proof:

"When God heals the sick or the sinning, they should know the great benefit which Mind has wrought. They should also know the great delusion of mortal mind, when it makes them sick or sinful. Many are willing to open the eyes of the people to the power of good resident in divine Mind, but they are not so willing to point out the evil in human thought, and expose evil's hidden mental ways of accomplishing iniquity.

week's Lesson, and guide us through a fascinating history of people and events in the Bible.

The beauty of each class is the light that Christian Science shines on the stories, which brings them alive and gives them relevance to us today. Those who participate can certainly feel the presence of the Spirit of God. We all come away from each class with a much greater understanding and appreciation for the Bible, and for Mrs. Eddy.

In reading "The Overwhelming Evidence Concerning Spiritual Healings Through Mary Baker Eddy" by Ralph Spencer, I came across the following paragraph:

"Christians are apt to accept the Scriptures only as historical facts, moral philosophy and religious doctrine. The most valuable part of the Scriptures, however, is the somewhat hidden portion, — the spiritual meaning that brings an awareness of God, and which the writers were endeavoring to set forth as best they could. But to set forth the things of the Spirit with material phraseology is not easy. It is no wonder that for thousands of years the Bible and other spiritual writings have been so misunderstood and have seemed so incomprehensible. Yet, man's underlying nature is of the Spirit, and it is this Spirit which he needs to discover and understand, so that he may partake more and more of his divine heritage. For a whole generation, our people have strayed farther and farther away from God and the things of God, and behold the mess that the world is in. Yet, the wonderful things of God are always available, and especially so to those who believe and pursue until they find."
