#### **BUILDING SITE**

### **NECESSARY DUTY**

With life on the desert, comes an obligation, and I have just performed that task. God's beauty in the form of a Cork Oak needs twice a week attention in the form of watering, and I have just stopped to do that. Not only do we have a church service on Sunday and a church meeting on Wednesday, but 15 minutes of these days is devoted to the watering the only vegetation on my lot.

# LIBRARY COMMITTEE

Thomas, who lives in New York City, began his search by visiting old, rare book stores in the City and finding some old books on Christian Science.

### **No Unauthorized Literature**

There is ample evidence that Mrs. Eddy felt Christian Scientists should be free to read or write any book they so choose on Christian Science. Mrs. Eddy wrote on page 76 in *Retrospection and Introspection*: "Christian Science is not copyrighted .... A student can write voluminous works on Science without trespassing, if he writes honestly ...."

One advantage of the Plainfield CS library is that it already included many precious and rare books on Christian Science. The formation of the Committee is building on a great foundation.

The Library Committee seeks to find copies of these books and publications to add to the Plainfield CS library. It is not the function of the library to have a comprehensive collection of Christian Science materials. We seek books that are important to understanding CS.

There are a number of types of books that people can consider when looking for books for the library:

 Published during MBE's lifetime (many of these are not found in Authorized Literature)

- Written by people who knew and loved MBE (e.g., Rev. Kratzer and Herbert Eustace)
- Books and publications distributed by the Rare Book Company
- Published or written by Gilbert Carpenter, Sr. and Jr.

However, it is of little value if we gather books and do not properly care for them. We want to ensure that they are available for future generations. Therefore, care and preservation of the books is particularly important. We are not experts in book preservation, but we feel it is important that we learn how to care for these books and apply what we learn. For those in Plainfield, they can help with organizing and the overall maintenance of the library. In addition, we also work to make them available online for anyone to read. For example, William Lyman Johnson's book is available online at plainfieldcs.com.

Furthermore, I have seen where rare CS books are available at reasonable prices. I think it is worthwhile for people to be on the lookout for opportunities to purchase a hard to find book at a reasonable price.

In summary, here are number of things that members can do:

- Make donations
- Search for used CS books
- Help in the care and preservation of the books
- Help with publishing books online

The library work is especially important CS work. It may seem that just reading S&H and the Bible is sufficient, and that is true. However, if you allow a central organization to control how you interpret these books, then you may not be learning as much as you can. Freedom to read is one way to stop this interference.
