MARTHA WILCOX 1941 ADDRESS

Excerpts (submitted by Jacob)

"Day by day, we should know that nothing unlike good is taking place. When we read or cognize that our liberty is being threatened by the dominating powers of autocracy, we can even take care of that, ... as we establish our thought on the side of Principle, ... the law that governs and cares for the universe." "In every Christian Science treatment the only adequate denial is the absolute nothingness of any phase of evil." "The desire to wipe a certain nation (race, religion) off the map, or to feel great disapproval of any person or group of people, is not the correct attitude for any Christian Scientist to

take. To make any error, however great, a personal error, is not the way to prove its nothingness. Our work as Christian Scientists is to prove the powerlessness and nothingness of erroneous thought. wherever it is seen or whatever its form, through our own correct mental position of God's allness." I paraphrase this from "The writings: allness omnipotence of God is the wholeness and substance of every human being." There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither bond nor free...for we are all one in Christ. There is only one substance.

THE CHURCH MANUAL

I have always been most interested in all histories, and the Church Manual is no exception. Realizing there was a lack of former editions available sparked my interest even more. How grateful we are to Mrs. Eddy for providing us with more and more up-to-date editions. Mrs. Eddy was always very careful—making sure all was most precisely stated. At Mrs. Eddy's passing, the 88th Edition of the Manual was in effect. Very shortly after this, the Board of Directors published the 89th Edition. They revised the Manual topic, "Present Order of Services in The Mother Church" by adding "and Branch Churches" to the topic. These three added words placed all churches under their control. In their haste to get the new edition published, they neglected to change the "Table of Contents" to reflect the new wording, and it remained thus for a number of vears.

Plainfield Church abides by the last edition written by Mrs. Eddy, the 88th Edition.

I am most grateful for the loyal member who helped me find early editions of the Manual. Those early Manual Editions are now preserved for others to view. It was through this research that I became interested in the Plainfield Christian Science Church, Independent and became a member.

THE SPIRITUAL JOURNEY OF GEORGE WASHINGTON

In April of 1778, Washington wrote the following to John Bannister about his army. "Order of Men in the Thirteen States have paid a more sanctimonious regard to their proceedings than the Army; and, indeed it may be questioned, whether there has been that scrupulous adherence to them by any other, for without arrogance, or the smallest deviation from truth, it may be said that no history now extant can furnish an instance of an Army's suffering such uncommon hardships as ours have done, and bearing them with the same patience and Fortitude. To see men without clothes to cover their nakedness, without blankets to lay on, without shoes, by which their marches might be traced by the blood from their feet, and almost as often without provisions as with; marching through frost and snow, and at Christmas taking up their Winter Quarters within a day's march of the enemy, without a house or hut to cover them til they could be built, and submitting to it without a murmur, is a mark of patience and obedience which in my opinion can scarce be paralleled."

Washington and his men publicly prayed that God would act on their behalf... as he had done on behalf of the first Israel.
