

A Visit to Morristown, N.J., with Bruce Singleterry

Not far from Plainfield, NJ in the nearby town of Morristown is the historical site of George Washington's Headquarters. There are two primary buildings on this site. One is a museum which contains many informative displays and antique artifacts and documents. The other building is the Ford mansion, which is the place where Washington was permitted to stay during the winter of 1779-1780, while the troops camped nearby in Jockey Hollow. Tours of the Ford mansion are conducted by the National Park Service. Below is a picture of the Ford mansion, the next picture is just inside the front door.

Our May Membership meeting had some interesting information about our recent church activities from our Website and Broadcasting Committee.

First, we just created our twentieth website. This one is in the language of Swahili, which is spoken in many African nations. We are grateful to be reaching even more sincere seekers. Within just two weeks, this website was already visited by 76 visitors who viewed 445 pages.

Since January, our English language website has had 73,000 visitors! And our English YouTube channel had 208,500 visitors and has 6,538 subscribers.

Our Spanish website has had 6,092 visitors and our Spanish YouTube channel has had 10,800 views and has 911 subscribers.

Our German website had 4,176 visitors; and the French website had 2,766 visitors, along with 2,300 YouTube views and 163 subscribers.

The first is the 121st Psalm.

Psalm 121

- ⁴ Behold, he that keepeth Israel shall neither slumber nor sleep.
- ⁵ The LORD is thy keeper: the LORD is thy shade upon thy right hand.
- ⁶ The sun shall not smite thee by day, nor the moon by night.
- ⁷ The LORD shall preserve thee from all evil: he shall preserve thy soul.
- ⁸ The LORD shall preserve thy going out and thy coming in from this time forth, and even for evermore.
