The Saint Anna Archipelago, above, is where I grew up, and my love of nature's beauty was ignited. "The divine Mind maintains all identities, from a blade of grass to a star, as distinct and eternal." (*S&H* p. 70) And each individual man, woman, or child is one of those identities.

The Saint Anna Archipelago, also known as Sankt Anna skärgård in Swedish, is an archipelago located along the Swedish Baltic Sea coast. It is one of Sweden's most beloved archipelago regions. Many people come here for sailing, kayaking, fishing, and island exploration.

The Saint Anna Archipelago comprises over 6,000 islands, islets, and skerries spread across an area of approximately 250 square kilometers. This impressive archipelago is renowned for its beautiful natural landscapes, with rocky shores, deep bays, and numerous small islands covered in lush vegetation.



Ale's Stones, also known as "Ale stenar" in Swedish, is a historic monument consisting of 59 large boulders arranged in the shape of a ship. Located in southern Sweden, it's believed to be a prehistoric burial site or a solar calendar, dating back to the Iron Age. The purpose of these stones continues to be a subject of debate among archaeologists and historians.



Havängsdösen, located in Sweden, is an ancient dolmen, stones arranged to form a chamber. This megalithic structure, dating back to the Neolithic era 4000-3000 BCE, stands as a testament to the early human presence in the region. The dolmen is characterized by its large, flat stones arranged to form a chamber.

Situated by the coastline, this dolmen provides a juxtaposition of ancient history and the natural beauty of the sea. The sound of waves crashing against the shore and the panoramic views of the Baltic Sea invite visitors to contemplate.



Krageholm's windmill. The mill was built in 1864 for Count Brahe at Krageholm castle. During the summer, the mill is open one weekend each month, where visitors can experience the milling process.

Havang offers a fusion of sandy shores, dramatic sand dunes, and thriving woodlands. The seamless blending of the sea, dunes, and forests transforms Haväng into an escape and retreat, perfect for those in search of harmony.



Smygehuk, nestled at the southernmost point of Sweden. Overlooking the Baltic Sea, this area has a rich maritime history. Fishing, particularly eel fishing, has held a significant role. It's also home to a boatyard specializing in wooden boats.



Bosjökloster, situated in southern Sweden, is a historic monastery. Originally founded in the 12th century, the monastery boasts impressive architectural features and a tranquil atmosphere.

In 1527, Bosjökloster ceased to function as a monastery due to the Reformation in Sweden. The monastery was confiscated along with its properties by the Swedish Crown, leading to the discontinuation of monastic life. It became a part of the Swedish Crown's possessions.
